PAPER DAY

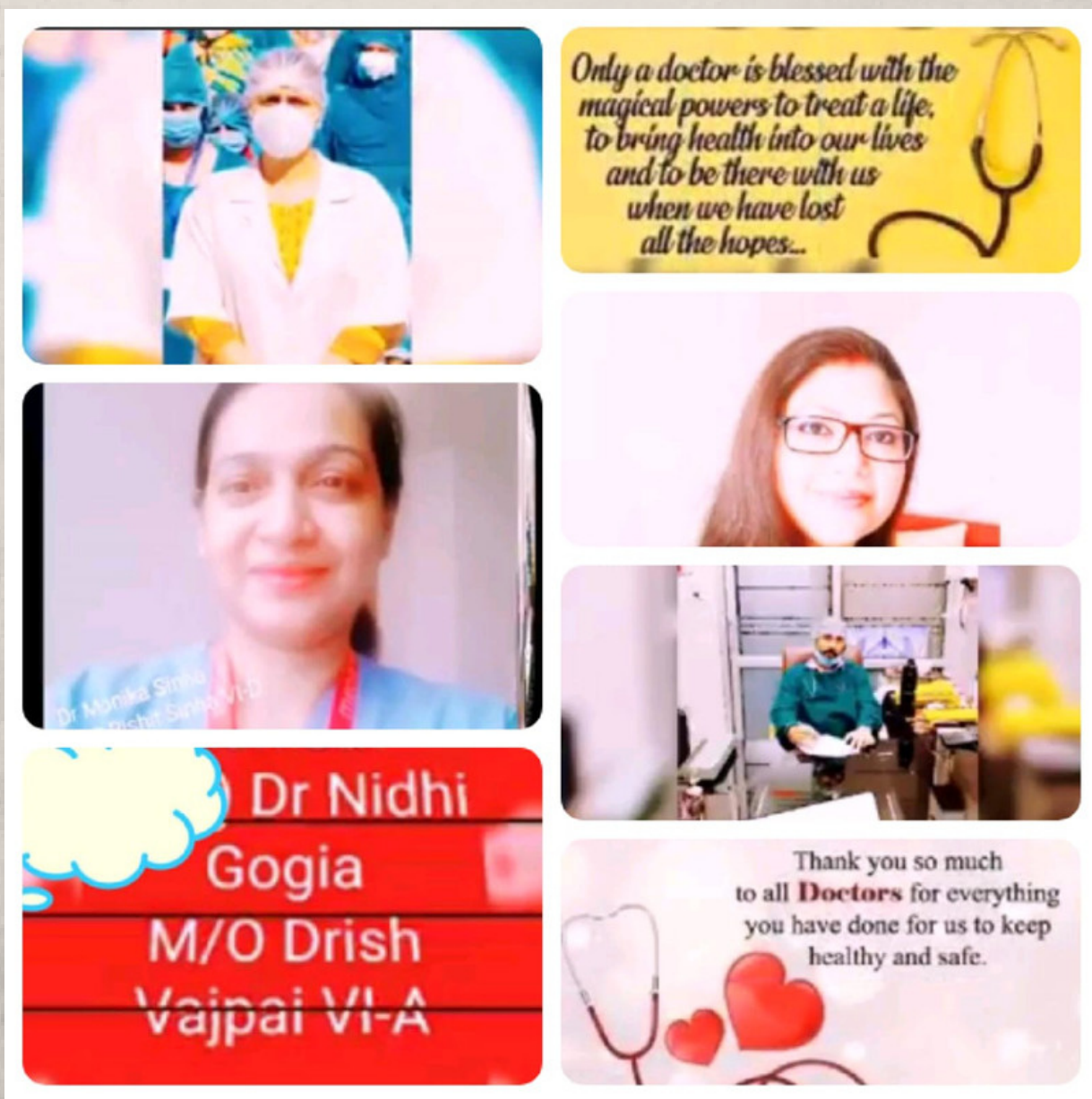

Photography Competition

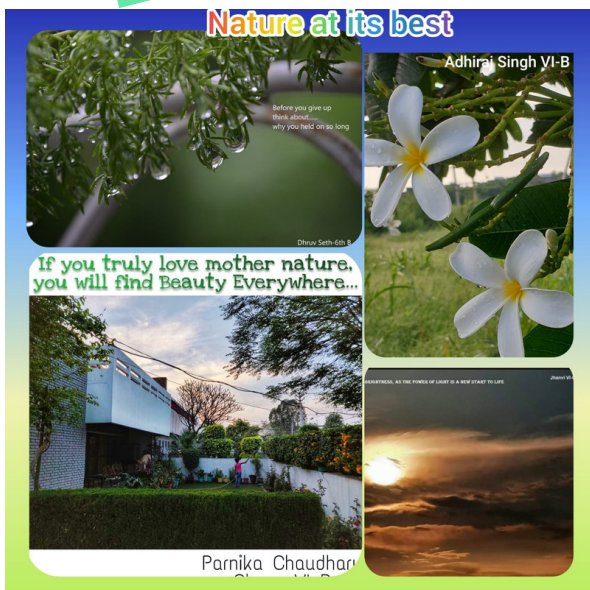
