MONDAYS LOGICAL REASONING BY

Week 1

Logical reasoning refers to the ability to understand and logically work through concepts and problems expressed in words. Children were taught Analogy in the first week. Students were taught analogy where they were made to compare two things that are mostly different from each other but have some traits in common. Children thoroughly enjoyed the session, as they were able to logically find a solution to a question.

Week 2

The children engrossed themselves in learning Magic with numbers where they were made to use their Mental Math skills. Mental Math is a skill that allows people to do math "in their head" without using pencil and paper or a calculator. This lesson presented the tricks that allowed the children to solve multiplication problems in a matter of seconds. Students thoroughly enjoyed the Mental Math session and it also helps improve concentration, problem-solving skills and reasoning abilities.

Week 3

In the third week the students were taught the Alphabet Series in order to prepare the kids for Olympiads and various challenging competitions. They were taught how to find the place of an alphabet or a word based on the different types of arrangements. Here, children learnt different forms of Alphabet Arrangements, problems based on Letter-Word, Alphabetical Quibble and New Word Formation, etc.
