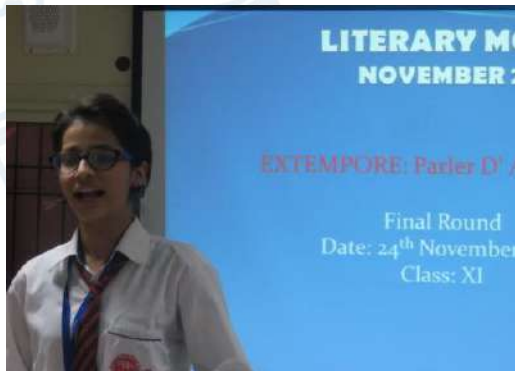

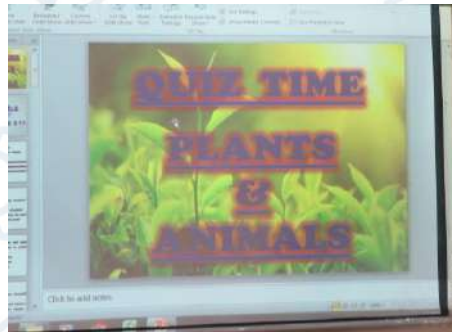

### Astronomy Day at Queen's Valley School, Dwarka

In the light of having a tete-e-tete with the universe, the Astronomy Club students of Module I and Module II organized 'Astronomy Day' on 29th November, 2017. The day was planned with the support and guidance of the SPACE Educator and the school coordinator. The members of the club got a platform to display their yearlong learning and nurture their existing talent.

The students began the day by showcasing various exhibits where they learned about comets and even saw a real comet in the making. They acquired knowledge about the concepts of time and directions, Jantar-Mantar, Barn-Door Tracker, DSLR, Advance Rocketry etc. They were also provided with directions regarding the usage of kit material that they receive on enrolling for the astronomy club. The students participated in various enjoyable and constructive activities, thereby promoting leadership skills, scientific temperament and logical reasoning.

The students witnessed the rocket launch and further learned about the intricate science of rockets. They also learned to observe the sun using safe methods like solar projection, pinhole projector, solar view goggles and ball projectors. The students also observed the sunspot. The tattoo making session was a hit among the young and eager participants. Overall, it was an enriching and informative experience for all.

Our Principal, Dr. Namita Sharma also motivated children with her presence at the event and stressed upon the need for such activities to develop a rational and humanitarian spirit among students.



### 27-11-2017: WORKSHOP ON MOLECULAR BIOLOGY



To uphold the notion of Hands-on and process based experience as an integral part of the science in a real life environment, Queen's Valley School, Dwarka, hosted a one-day workshop on molecular biology on 27th November 2017. This workshop was intended to give an opportunity to the students to engage in Kinesthetic learning also called as hands on learning or "Learning by doing", to understand the basic structure of DNA and to observe changes caused by enzymes and temperature, to isolate DNA from different sources in its pure form using combination of physical and chemical methods etc.



The event was organised by EduDAP (Discover and Apply Practical Education). EduDAP's hands-on training programmes gave students an opportunity to experience the connection between science in the classroom and in life. Medical students from Class XII along with their biology teacher actively participated in the workshop and learnt about new tools and techniques like Micro pipette, Micro Centrifuge, Gel Caster and Electrophoresis Unit, UV Transilluminator and Power Pack. Experiments conducted during the workshop were DNA isolation, DNA purification, gel electrophoresis and visualisation of DNA bands on gel.

It was indeed an enriching experience for the students as it also encouraged students to explore science career option, especially those related to life science and biotechnology and to make them skill ready to be a step ahead while entering colleges and industries.

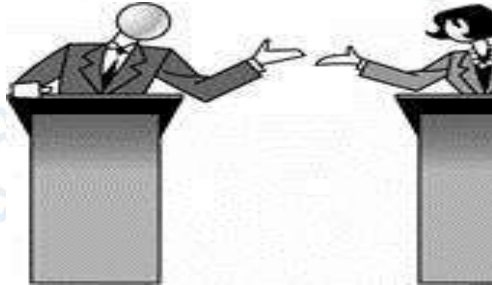

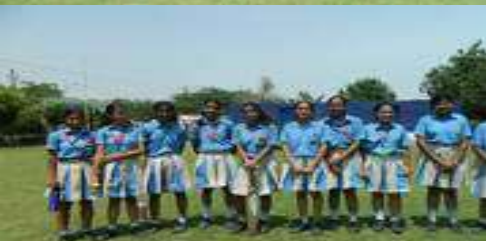

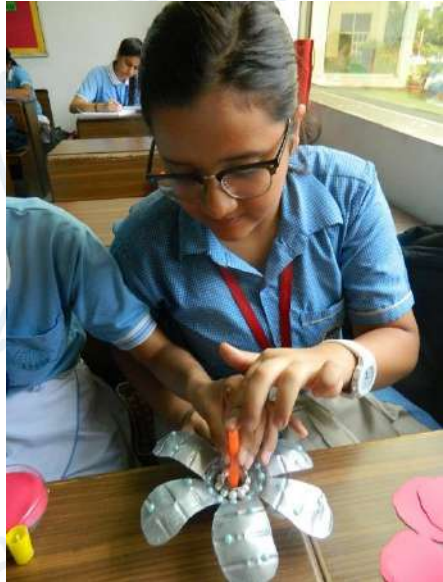
