## 12.04.2013 – Green School Programme: Gobar Times Award



Waste management is a practice which focuses on delaying the rate of consumption of natural resources. For the same, QVS joined hands with Green School Programme. The programme is based on an audit of the school's environmental practices, carried out by its own students. The objective of this programme is to create zero-waste zone in the school. It focuses on the collection, transport, processing or disposal, managing and monitoring of waste materials. It refers to waste materials produced by human activity, and the process is generally undertaken to reduce their effect on health, the environment or aesthetics.



The Gobar Times Green Schools Programme is a platform to acknowledge and reward schools which focuses on adaptation of the most innovative and effective practices to manage natural resources within the school's premises and excel in the field of managing their resources. The Queens of classes IX- XI enthusiastically participated in the Gobar Times Awards as part of 'Green School Programme' by preparing an environmental audit report of the school. The award ceremony to felicitate the winners in various categories was held on 12th April' 2013 at India Habitat Centre in New Delhi. Various schools from Delhi and across the nation participated in the Green School competition.



This year's awards were presented by Mr. Ramakant Goswami, minister of transport, election, law and labour, Government of Delhi, and members of the popular Indian rock band, Indian Ocean. The awards were divided into two main categories – National and State. The 20 national awards were further sub-divided into two segments of 10 awards each – the New Schools (those which have done the environmental audit for the first time and have excelled) and Change makers (those which have already done the environmental audit once before and continue to excel). Amongst the fifty leading schools of Delhi Queen's Valley School bagged the second prize at the State level and fourth prize at the National level in the category of Change Makers. The queens also participated in a street play competition where they won the first prize showing the people of Delhi that the environment can be looked after by maintaining harmony with the neighbourhood. It was a moment of great pride for QVS to receive such a prestigious award from the Honourable Minister of Delhi who motivated our students to reach even greater heights. 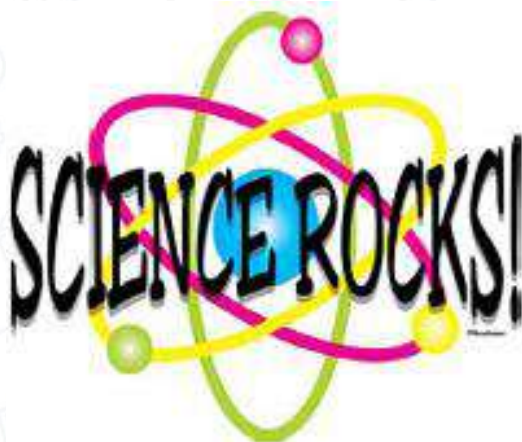
**17.07.2013 & 19.07.2013 - CATALYST : INTER-CLASS SCIENCE QUIZ**

**15.07.2013 – FIRE MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP**



July 15, 2013, New Delhi: The personnel and students of Queen's Valley School were enthralled with the benign presence of Mr. Netra Pal Singh, Principal, Delhi Institute of Fire Training and his learned team who gave them a unique opportunity to enhance their existing training with a procedural understanding of combating fire hazards as an integral part of an organization's daily activities. This workshop was conducted with the aim to inculcate structured and systematic techniques to identify fire hazards, evaluate risks and prioritize actions.

Mr. Singh focused on the need to develop effective procedures to fight any fire outbreak, whether large or small, that might occur during the functioning of the school. It is therefore important to develop a response plan aimed at addressing the awareness and the mechanism necessary for its response. He thus emphasized the fact that schools should be equipped with fire alarm detection and notification systems, and fire suppression systems like hydrants and fire extinguishers to ensure maximum safety of life and property during a blaze. At the same time, schools should have an effective communication system to regulate an emergency situation effectively.

The DIFT team conducted a fire drill as part of a standard emergency response procedure. At the same time, they stressed upon the fact that such drills should be executed at different hours of the day during the changing of classes, when the school is at assembly, during the recess or gymnastic periods, or during other times to avoid distinction between drills and actual fire. The means to use a fire extinguisher was also demonstrated by the DIFT personnel to empower the teachers and students in a hazardous situation.

in the picture, the quality and clarity of picture and the explanation /presentation given by the participants.

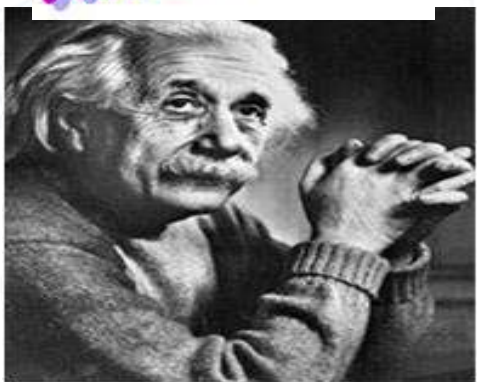

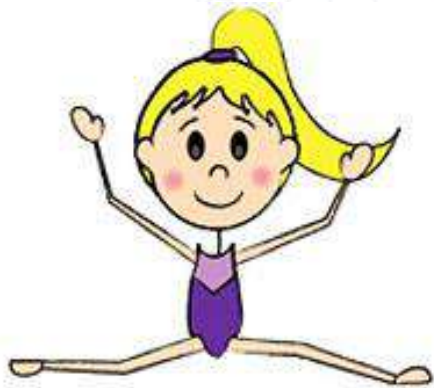
**26.08.2013 – Inter-House Gymnastics**

**At the CBSE Regional Science Exhibition 2013**



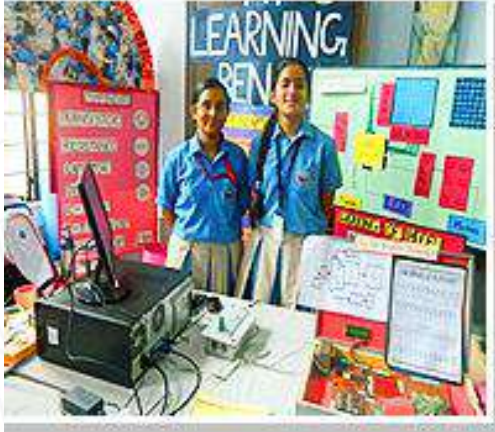

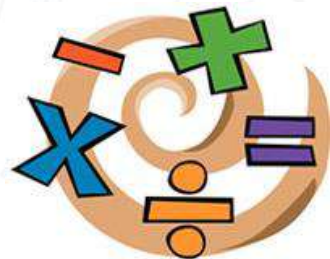


**18.11.2013 – Inter Class Mathematical Mascot Competition**



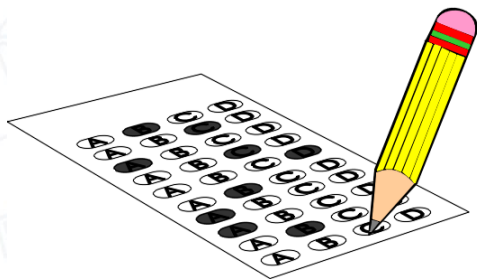

25.01.2014 : Annual Day Celebration



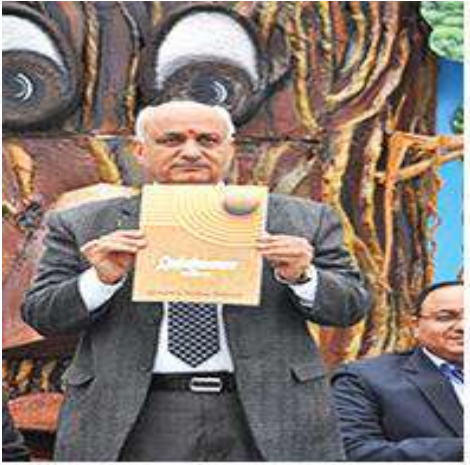
**India is the fountain of the human race,
