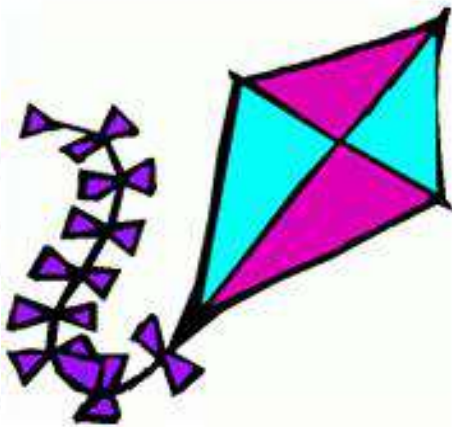
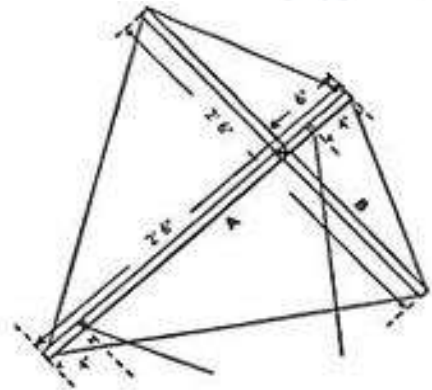
## 21.07.2010 - KITE MAKING COMPETITION

26.07.2010 - Hindi Poetry Competition (Subject: Patriotism)



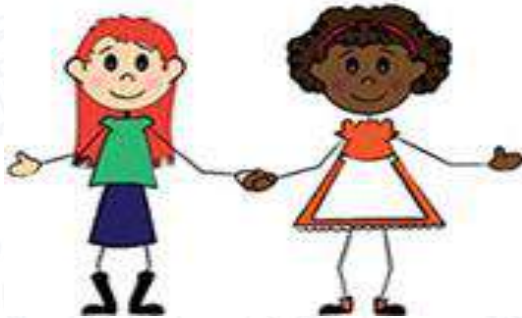

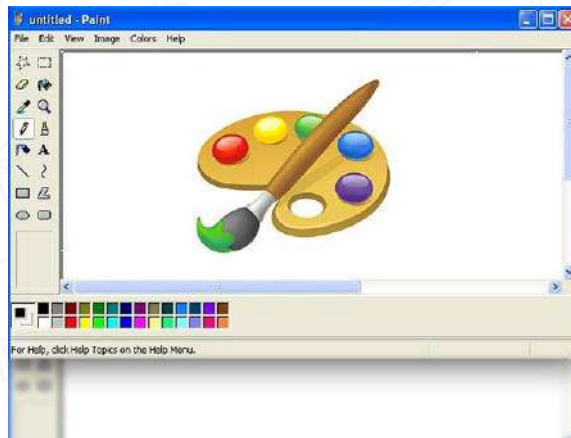

The shaping up of torn bits of paper and zigzag cutting into a unique figure was unbelievable!

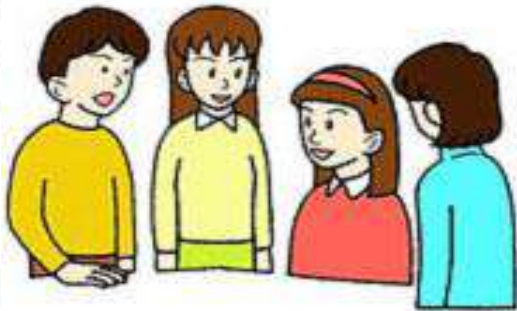
## 30.10.10: Girls Kabaddi Championship (under 17)

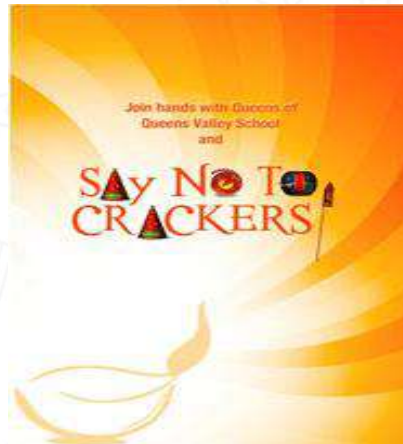

6. Rub both palms with finger tips, then rinse and dry your hands.

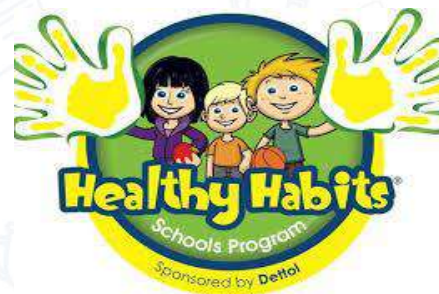
Wet your hands under warm running water and apply soap.

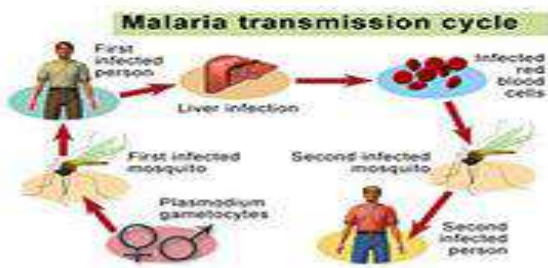

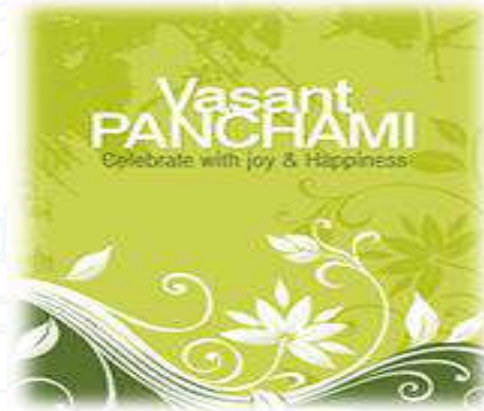

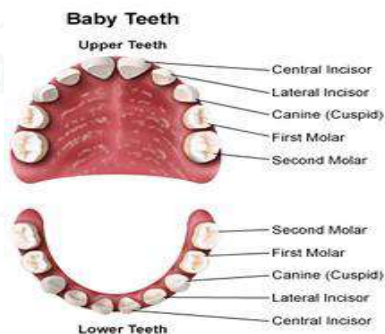
