As we left our little town, we jumped from person to person so that we could travel far and wide. We got to see America, Australia and Europe.






My brothers and sisters and I do not wish to hurt people. But as we visited each new city and country, we saw people beginning to cough and become very poorly. Most of the children did not get ill,








