



## DESIGN WORKSHOP 2019

A two day design workshop for Fashion Studies teachers, was organized at Mumbai by ITM Institute of Design and Management on 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> September 2019. Twenty five teachers from all over India participated in the event, out of which, nine schools were from Delhi. **ITL Public School** got an opportunity to be one of them. Highly experienced resource persons, pass outs from NID and NIFT, empowered the teachers with advanced knowledge of textile designing. It was an extremely engrossing visual and practical learning session with optimum output.

The first day started with the **Shibori** workshop, conducted by Ms Preeti Khode, an expert in Japanese tie and dye. She demonstrated the different techniques of Shibori, namely **KUMO** "spiderweb", **ORI-NUI** "teeth", **MOKUME** "wood grain", **ITAJIME** and **ARASHI** "storm". The teachers were also taught the proper method of block printing by Ms Sonali. At the end of the day, they had hands on experience and learned a lot.

The second day was full of activities. Beginning with a visit to a design museum **Dr Bhauji Lal Sangrahalaya**, established in 1975 which showcased the best in Indian craftsmanship. It exhibited aesthetically designed porcelain vases, miniature models of Indian villages, temples, Indian regiment during British rule, paier mache of Kashmir, Nakkashi on Silkhadi, Kasidakari and many more. The museum itself was an epitome of beautiful architecture. The day followed with a city tour to Gateway of India, Collaba, Haji Ali and Sea link.

Each and every moment of the workshop had been efficiently utilized. Indeed, it was highly educative, thoroughly inclusive and productive workshop for the teachers.
