A workshop on ASL for the Master Trainer was organized by CBSE from 7 Sept – 11 Sept. 2015 at CBSE Centre for Training, Gurgaon. Delicate nuances of an examiner training were conducted through an array of role plays and gaming activities. Monitoring and Mentoring was another input for refined learning index. Strategies on commutative timing during speaking skills, was another smart method to aid examiners.
