The Government of India has launched National Leprosy Eradication Programme (NLEP) to overcome the major challenges associated with leprosy , also termed as Kusht Rog in India.

MBS International School, Sector-11, Dwarka, New Delhi took initiative by organising a Health Talk camp for leprosy awareness on 27 September 2024 for the students of classes III - X. During the camp the students were informed about the facts associated with the disease through visual presentation aiming to inform students about the causative agent, mode of spread of disease, its early symptoms and steps taken by our government to eradicate leprosy. Speech focusing on the need for inclusion of these individuals in our society was given to sensitize future citizens and combat discrimination against those suffering from the disease.

The report of the awareness camp was shared on social media to encourage community members to recognize the challenges associated with Hansen's disease and promote the inclusion of affected individuals.

Additionally, leprosy screening for school children was conducted by a Special Education Teacher, with no cases identified within the school.

Overall, valuable information about leprosy was shared with students and the wider community to enhance support and foster the inclusion of individuals affected by the disease.
