I believe in the established notion of three constants in life... change, choice and principles.



ENGLISH LITERARY ACTIVITIES

JMIS is committed to develop and hone the literary skills of the students from the very early years to their pre-university years. Apart from engaging in literary activities within the classroom, there are numerous post school activities which students can engage in based upon their interest.

This year we celebrated CBSE recommended 'Reading-week', from September 7-14. LITFEST 2020, The event comprised of various online and offline activities which were allotted class wise. The Students if class IIIrd - VIIIth, participated in the event.

1. READ-MAX ACTIVITY/CONTEST (Grade III-VIII)


Students had to read the maximum possible stories (English or/and Hindi). It was heartwarming to see how enthusiastically, children participated in this activity.

2. KAHAANIKAAR (The original story writing Contest) (Grade III-VIII)

MATHEMATICS DAY CELEBRATION THROUGH GAMES AND ACTIVITIES

Learning by doing is always the most efficacious and productive way of learning mathematical concepts Students understand mathematical skills. and concepts better through mathematical fun activities. JMIS celebrated the World Maths Day for developing student's heed and interest towards maths by making it very easy through fun filled learning activities. All the grades from Ankur to VIII participated in various Maths activities like Rangometry activity for understanding shapes and patterns, Ganit mala and counting race activity for counting, spinning the wheels activity for accurate calculations and Number Art activity. Maths Relay race activity was conducted various for various maths concepts for complex calculations. Winners were awarded with certificates. Maths Hots Contest also held for Grade Ankur -VIII.

MAP ACTIVITY GRADE VII

Using maps in the class activities invites curiosity, encourages exploration and inspires problem solving. Maps can be used to explore a multitude of topics and can incorporate visual learning, spatial thinking and quantitative skills.

A map activity was organised for Grade VII students based on their previous knowledge about the history and culture of Indian States.

SOCIAL SCIENCE

Students were divided in different groups to research about the given Indian states and union territories. Specific cultural events and historical monuments were suggested to groups for research purpose. During the presentation students shared the information collected with a collage of information about the state. Apart from activities historical cultural and importance, the students also shared information about state politics, biodiversity and climate government, conditions of the state. For conclusion teacher asked students to identify the state from the given images and share any interesting fact about the state. From the activity students learnt about the location and features about Indian states, research and team work, presentation skill.

SCIENCE

"Science is a way of thinking much more than it is a body of knowledge."

To learn science is to do science. In this context, teaching of science gain significant importance and it needs an appropriate method. Some methods that can be used can be demonstration method, laboratory method, assignment method, project method, problem solving method, role playing method and brain storming method. It is upto a teacher's discretion to choose the method which is most suitable for a certain topic in a certain class. So, we at JM use innovative method to develop process skills and creativity. Some of them are:





PROJECT BASED LEARNING

To explore new means to deal with the problem of energy crisis. The soil near the plant roots is rich in ions. This fact can be explored for electricity generation. For this exciting activity of electricity generation from the roots of the plants. We used copper and zinc rods as electrodes and produced electricity from plants. First of all, electricity produce was just sufficient enough to cause deflection in a galvanometer. Later on, when connected in series, it was possible to light LEDs too. This all was really exciting for students. They exhibited this activity to the parents and their class mates too.

DEMONSTRATION


Refraction introduced by demonstrating few activities A pencil was dipped in a glass half full of water. It appeared to be broken at the interface.

 printed letters on a page appear to be raised when seen through a glass slab.

- Also, an object appears bigger than its normal size when dipped in water.
- Children were then asked to repeat all these activities and observe by themselves. The reason for the same was explained to them and hence 'refraction of light' was introduced.

LEARNING BY DOING


- Change of turmeric when added with acidic and basic substances.
- Students understood how the turmeric changes its color on being added with an acid or a base and how it acts as an indicator to test the substance i.e. whether it is an acid or a base. After performing the activity, the students were curious to know why turmeric shows different change in color when added with acid and base. Students came up with some real-life examples also where they have observed it.



EXPLORATION

The main objective of the activity is that students will able to understand how sound is produced. The students have performed these activities by themselves, using a colourless polythene packet, a wide mouth tin can, a rubber band or string, a few grains of puffed rice, a metal tray or a steel vessel, a wooden stick or ruler.

Sound is created when an object moves and the air around it vibrates creating sound waves. Students have performed and able to conclude that sound is produced through vibrations. Science is a subject which helps to understand the things learning by doing. Students have enjoyed the activity as they have performed on their own. All the students were engaged and enjoyed the session.






VISITS

As a part of a health campaign, Class XI and XII students from our school interacted with doctors on various health related issues in Manipal Hospital at Dwarka, Delhi. They learnt what to do during a casualty and how to perform CPR. The students were briefed about how a hospital functions, starting from the casualty ward, ICU and an operation theatre.

They got medical lessons from the doctors and information about latest technology. This visit removed all the unwanted thoughts/fear from children's minds. This is also an eye opener in terms of career option for students. They would realize that it is not doctors alone who is serving the society in a hospital. But, others like lab technicians also play a key role.

SYMPOSIUM

The students prepared presentation which included all the information, facts about flora and fauna, their experiences of visiting various places. Use of board, power point presentation, quiz, Uncommon facts about the species belonging to different habitats made the virtual session, an unforgettable one. Highly enriched videos were chosen and shown during the session. The students were assessed on the basis of their virtual presentation, confidence and the value of the content.



RANGMANCH - THEATER

Theatre is a collaboration of different players as it is an ensemble. Students will learn improvisation, and understand how to appraise situations, think outside the box and be more confident going into unfamiliar situations.

Communication skills in children are strengthened, apt articulation, tone of speech and expression are enhanced by portraying shades of emotions, which they themselves might be experiencing, often allowing for a period of reflection afterwards. Understanding characters, the subtext of plays and musicals allows students to relate better to different backgrounds, and cultures. Combining the creative ideas and abilities of all participants is required for the best outcomes. This requires sufficient discussions, feedback and rehearsing and therefore teaches students team work.

LITERACY CLUB

The Literary Club is conceived for the love of the languages exhibited by all teachers and students.

The Club inculcates among students a flair for varied languages, the diverse literature and texts. It enhances their literary skills. It induces reading habit in students. It encourages students to become orators and display their intellectual, independent thinking skills and instills a sense of confidence. It provides a platform for debating events. It paves a way for creative writing in the young minds by organizing story writing, poem writing, slogan writing, lime rill, report writing, para writing, article writing activities in the school.

In this way the talent of the students is honed and developed.




ECO - CLUB

Eco Clubs play a pertinent role in creating environmental awareness amongst the future generation. It is an effective platform which promotes the participation of students, in learning about, and improving their surroundings.

It builds attitudes and helps students take up activities in real world, in a way in which the constraints of the classroom and curriculum boundaries get extended.

Promoting ethos of conservation of water, motivating students to imbibe habits and life style for minimum use of plastic, sensitizing the kids by organizing nature trails in wild life sanctuaries, natural parks, bio reserves are the key intents. It encourages multiple perspectives that one derives from the texts and discussion with other members of the group.

It promotes critical thinking in kids as they review and judge a book or an article, with their likes and dislikes about it. The reflection and after thought that one brings after reading a piece, is for keeps. A reading club is thus the best way to infuse in students the inclination and appreciation for disparate topics.

MUDDA FORUM-DEBATING FORUM

Knowing how to synthesize information and deliver it to an audience succinctly, even an audience of one, is a skill that benefits people throughout their lives. Outside of the working world, having good oratory skills is useful in activities as ordinary as meeting new people, as debate helps people learn composure and confidence when speaking with others. The students become informed about their surroundings and show keen interest in everyday issues like politics, environmental challenges, laws and regulations enhancing their critical thinking skills due to extensive reading.



PEEP INTO A SERIES OF NOVELTY ACTIVITIES



- Had mainly brothers as siblings, hence was very close to her elder sister, also named Cassandra
- The siblings lived in an environment of creativity, open learning and dialogue
- At the age of 8, she was sent to boarding school with her sister Cassandra By 1787, she started writing stories and poems
- At the age of 27, she moved with her entire family to the town of Bath
- Her first novel. Sense and Sensibility , was published in October of 1811 .the first edition was sold out by 1813.
- In January 1813, her second book Pride and Prejudice was published and was an instant success
- Under her new publisher John Murray's watch, Emma, Mansfield Part, Northanger Abbey and Persuasion w publisher don Murray's watch, Emma, Mansfield Part, Northanger Abbey and Persuasion w published
- In the beginning of 1816, there was a decline in her health, but she didn't stop with her current works
- By April 1817, her health had deteriorated a lot
- On July 18th, 1817, she died and with her the conclusions of her unfinished works were also lost





It was showing a great increase in my blood cells. For the next 2 months, this was coming

in my dreams. The power of dream was so enormous that I could see it in day time also. After a few days, this <u>become</u> my habit and I was also liking it. I was only thinking about that dream and was loving it with my heart. This <u>become</u> a strong weapon to fight against Typhoid and malaria. This is what I call

"POWER OF VISUALISATION". With the help of this, my <u>recover</u> rate saw a sky rocket. My high body temperature was also coming down and within 2 weeks I got cured from Typhoid and Malaria.

Moral- The work done by Heart and faith is more fruitful than the work done by taking stress and pressure. The benefit of doing the work by heart is, we understand the value of the thing. Work done by taking stress and pressure decreases our hope and increases tension, increasing tension means no fruitful result.


