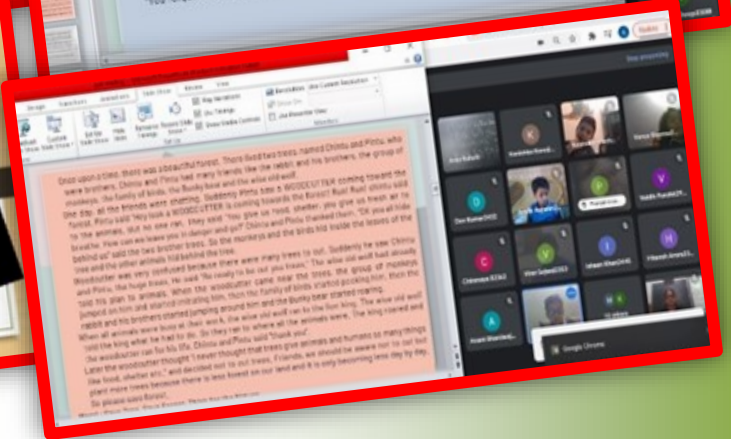
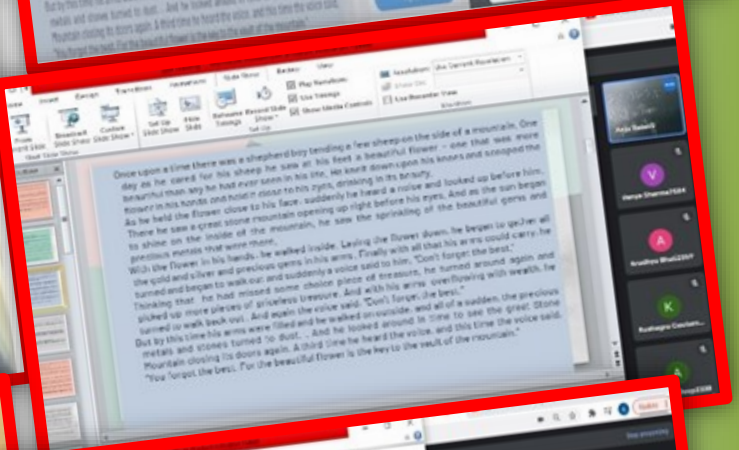
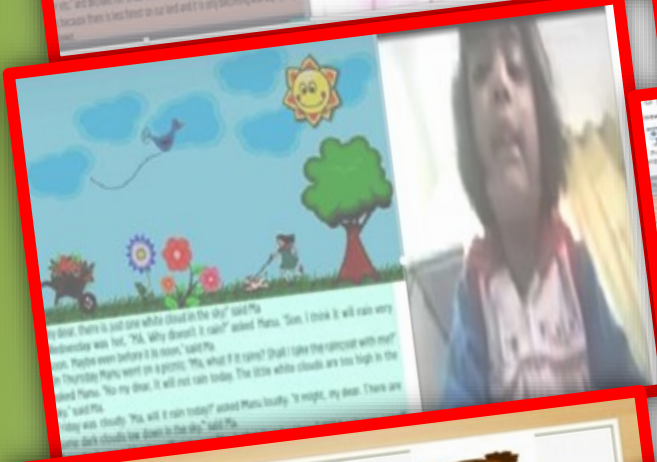
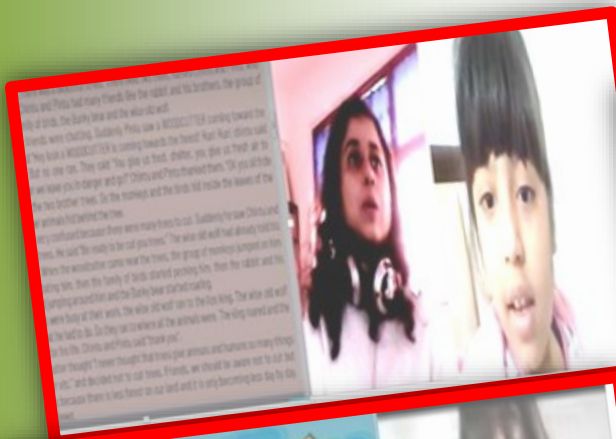
(Spontaneous Reading Contest in English)

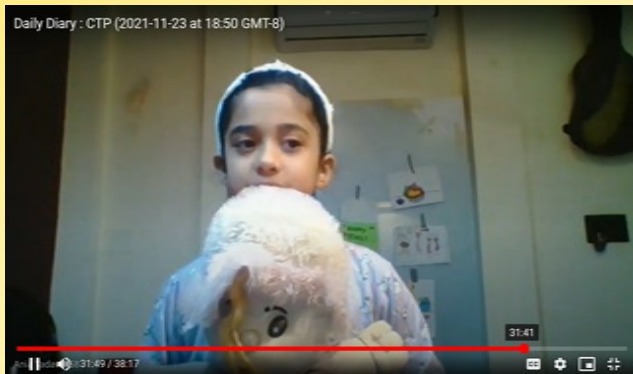
STORYTELLERS

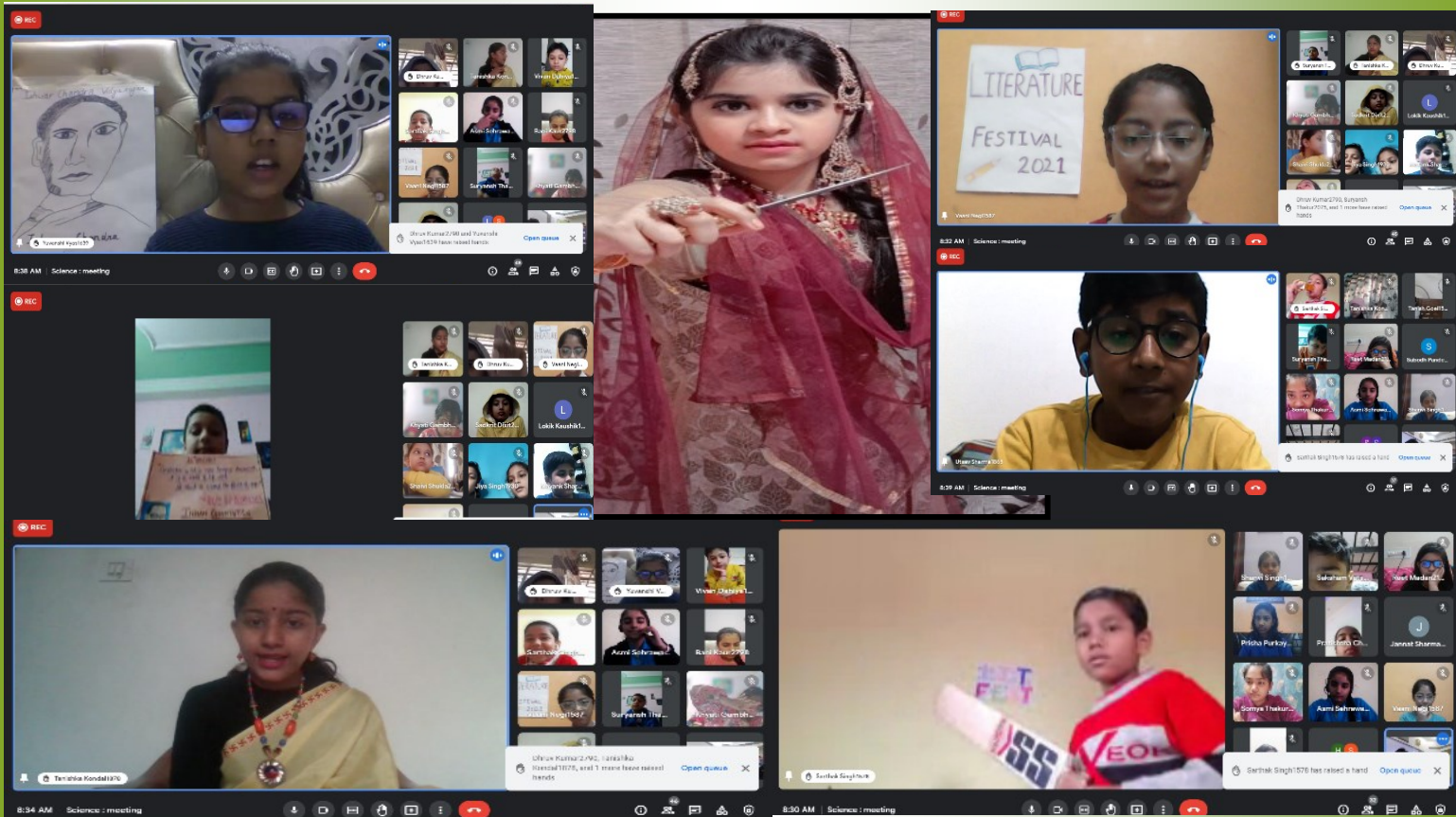

(Humorous poem in Hindi)

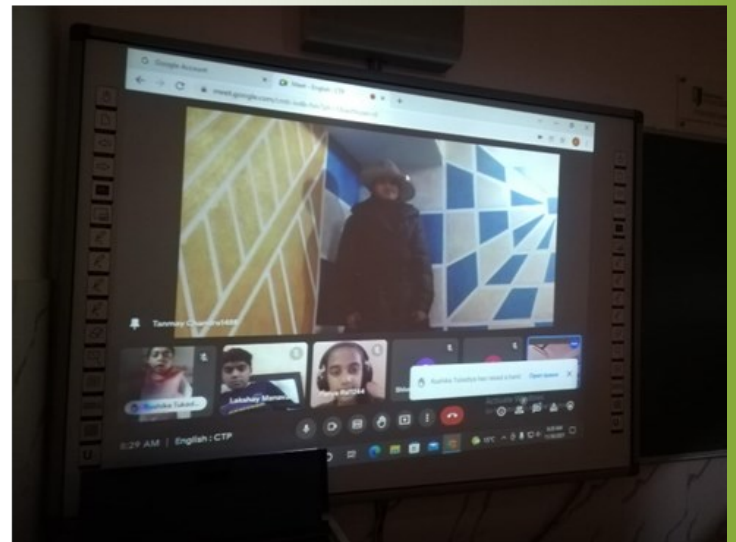

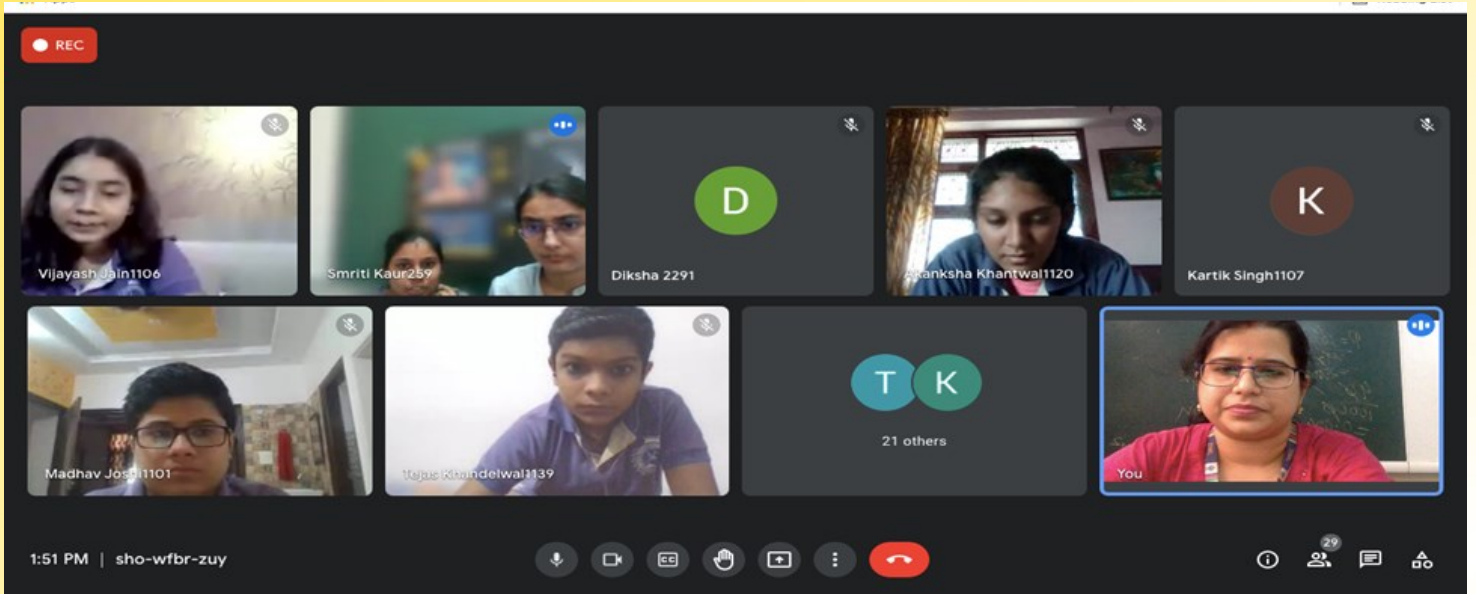
