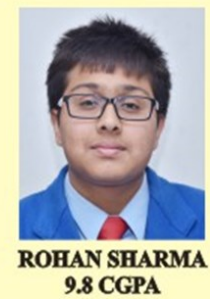

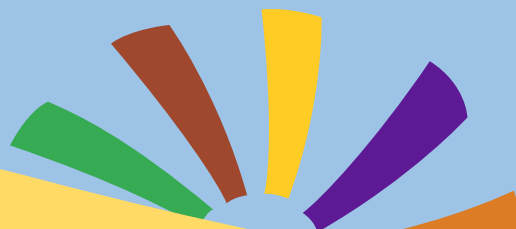

Video Conference with Students of St Monica School,Australia

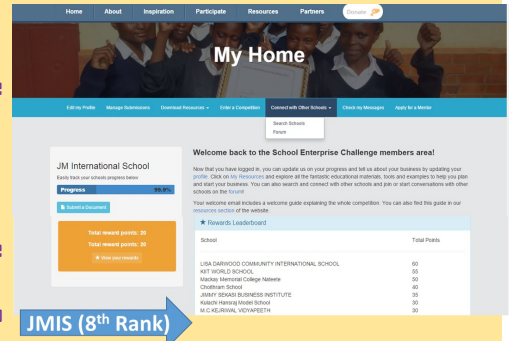
JM International School organised a video conference with Australian students of **St Monica on Wednesday 26 August 2015 on the topic, Environment .**

THOTS



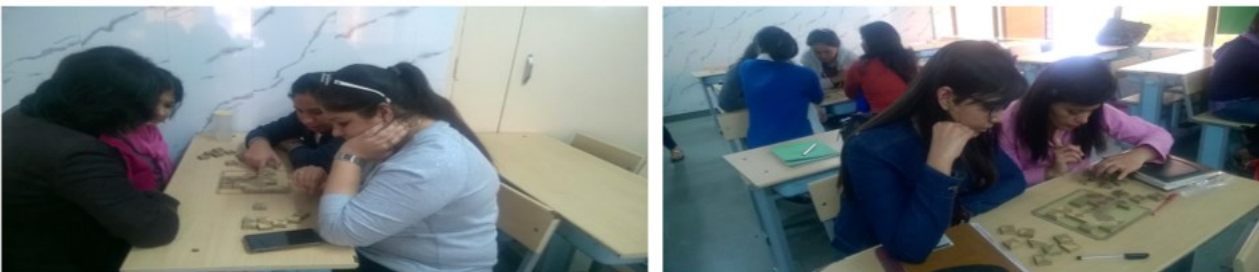

THOTS facilitates learning through the aid of physical tools and assessment worksheets. The physical tools and Mind Games used, makes learning easy and fun, while the worksheets helps in assessing the thinking skills developed. Each thinking game that is used aims at developing the required thinking skills in children. Thus learning through THOTS is fun and refreshing and hence children tend to learn quickly as they get involved completely.

ASSEMBLY BY CLASS 3-5 ON SWATCHTA ABHIYAN

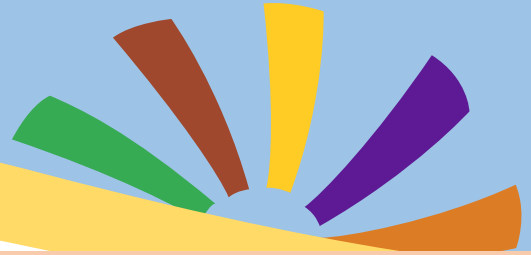

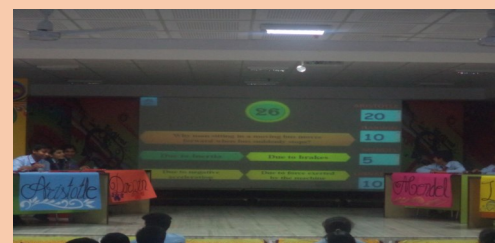

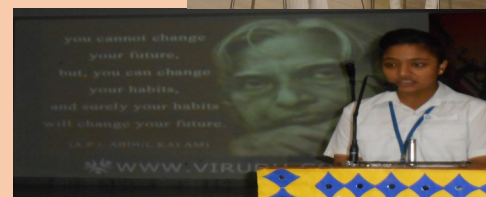

A video of Bill Gates journey from childhood to Entrepreneurship was shown.

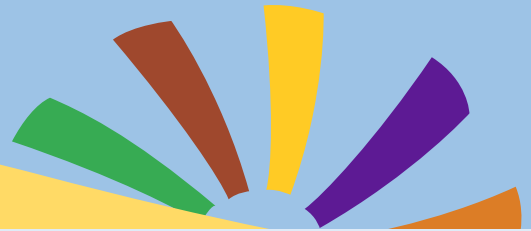

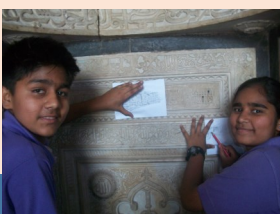


