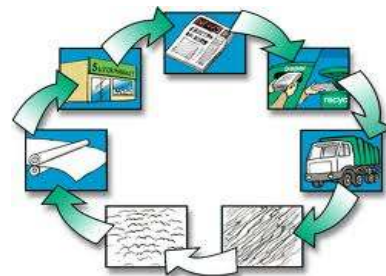
ANNUAL CONVENTION: INDIAN ASSOCIATION OF PHYSICS TEACHERS (IAPT)

Eminent personalities and teachers of physics presented their case study on highly valuable topics. Prof Krishan Lal from Indian National Science Academy gave a wonderful presentation about “Fascinating world of Crystals” which covered all the important aspects of crystal structure of diamond and interfacial angles of different crystals. The demonstrations were also given on Ohm’s Law, Refractive index of liquid, Projectile motion etc.
