I. Overview

This policy aims to provide a structured and comprehensive approach to academic and career guidance for students from Kindergarten through Grade 12. The goal is to equip students with the necessary tools, knowledge, and support to make informed decisions regarding their academic and professional pursuits.



II. Roles and Responsibilities

A. School Administration

- 1. Ensure effective implementation and regular review of the Academic and Career Guidance Policy.
- 2. Provide resources and support to facilitate the smooth functioning of guidance programs.
- 3. Appoint a dedicated Academic and Career Guidance Counselor.

B. Academic and Career Guidance Counselor

- 1. Offer individual and group counseling sessions.
- 2. Conduct assessments and evaluations to help students understand their strengths, weaknesses and aptitudes.
- 3. Provide up-to-date information on academic and career options.
- 4. Organize workshops, seminars and career fairs to expose students to various career options.
- 5. Support students to challenge stereotypes, promote equity and encourage all students to pursue their aspirations without bias or inhibitions.
- 6. Aid students in the college application process
- 7. Engage in ongoing professional development to stay updated on industry career trends and career development strategies.
- 8. Participate in professional networking activities to build relationships with stakeholders in the field of career development.
- 9. Collaborate with teachers, parents and external professionals to ensure a holistic approach to guidance.

C. Teachers

- Collaborate with the Academic and Career Guidance Counselor to identify students' needs and concerns.
- 2. Disseminate information gained from authentic sources about latest career trends in one's field of specialization.
- 3. Integrate career-related information into their teaching.



4. Encourage students to explore various academic and career options.

D. Parents

- 1. Actively participate in parent-teacher meetings and guidance sessions.
- 2. Encourage open communication with their children regarding academic and career choices.
- 3. Support their children in exploring various opportunities and attending guidance events.
- 4. Help their children in an effective decision-making process pertaining to their career.

III. Academic Guidance Program

A. Early Years and Grade 2

- 1. Focus on developing foundational skills and fostering curiosity.
- 2. Encourage exploration of various subjects and activities.

B. Primary Stage (Grades 3 to 5)

- 1. Introduce students to different learning styles and study strategies.
- 2. Guide students in setting realistic academic goals.
- 3. Provide information about academic subjects and their importance.

C. Middle Stage (Grades 6 to 8)

- 1. Help students analyze their academic strengths and weaknesses.
- 2. Offer guidance on selecting appropriate subjects and courses for higher grades.
- 3. Conduct workshops on effective study techniques and time management.

D. Secondary Stage (Grades 9 to 10)

- 1. Provide in-depth information on CBSE board exam requirements and preparation strategies.
- 2. Assist students in exploring various streams and subject combinations for higher secondary education.



E. Senior Secondary Stage (Grades 11 to 12)

- 1. Help students develop a deeper understanding of their chosen subjects and potential career paths.
- 2. Provide resources and guidance on entrance exams and college applications.
- 3. Facilitate internships, industry visits and mentorship programs.
- 4. Provide opportunities to collaborate with renowned educational institutions and enroll for certificate courses.

IV. Career Guidance Program

Grades 9-12

A. Career Awareness

- 1. Introduce students to various career options.
- 2. Conduct career exploration activities and workshops.

B. Career Exploration

- 1. Assist students in understanding their interests, aptitudes, and career aspirations.
- 2. Provide resources for researching different careers.

C. Career Planning

- 1. Offer individual counseling sessions to develop personalized career plans.
- 2. Organize career fairs and seminars with professionals from various fields.



D. Informed Decision making

The focus of the career-counseling department specifically for Grades 9-12 is to assist students to make informed decisions through:

- Administration of Psychometric tests in Collaboration with Cogitohub, an Education Consulting and Technology company. They conduct Psychometric Assessments for Grades 8 to 12 students, enabling them to make the right decisions regarding subjects, courses and colleges.
