INTER CLASS ENGLISH POEM WRITING COMPETITION



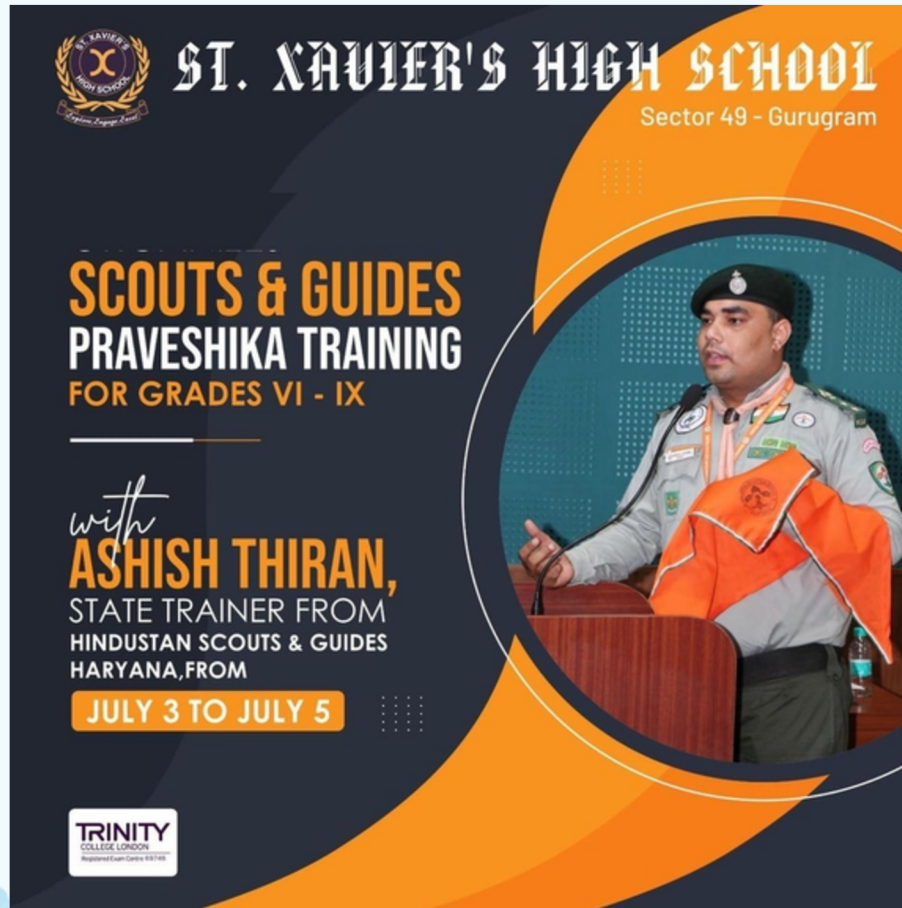

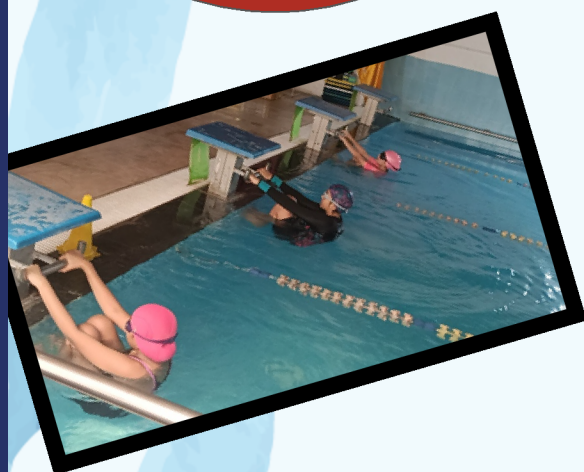

CLASS ASSEMBLY BY VIII-H

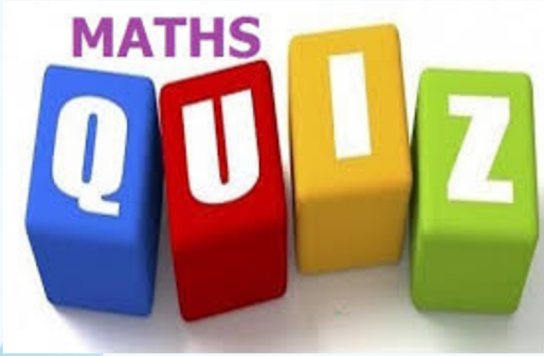

FLAG HOISTING

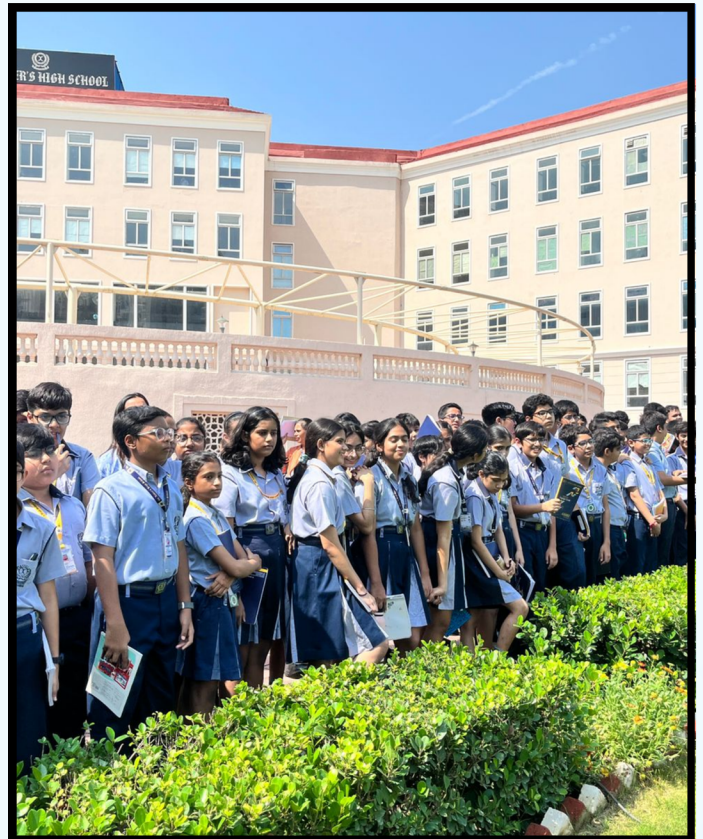

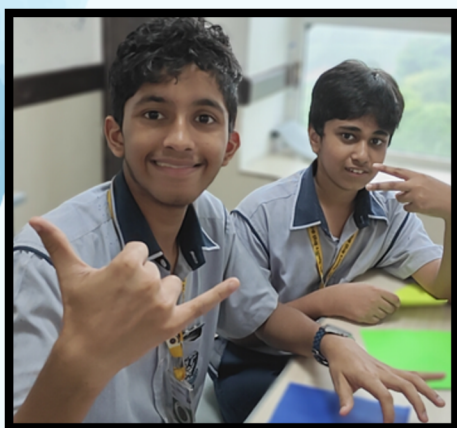

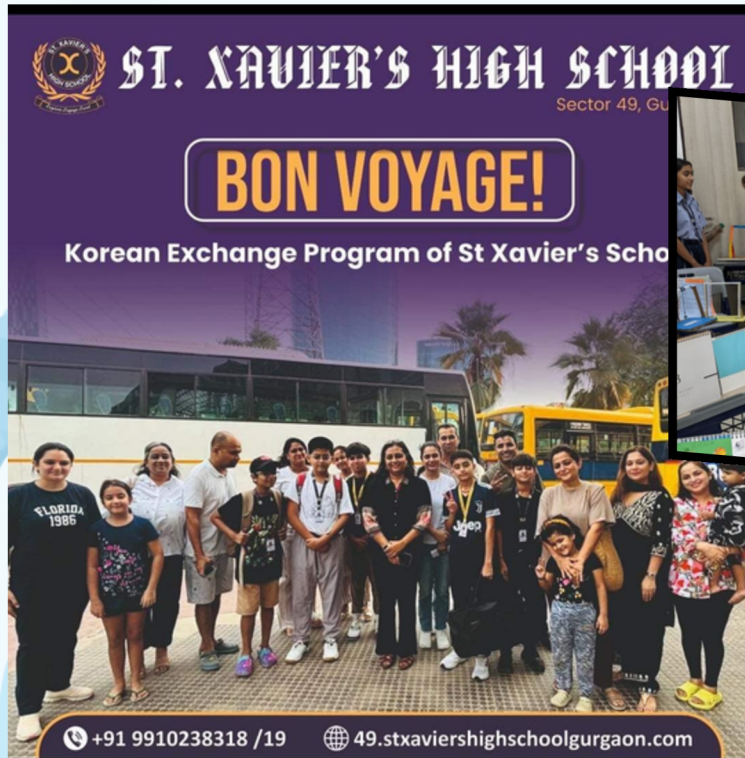
