
Workshop Conducted on Financial Literacy and Entrepreneurship for Grades VI-IX

The school had organised a Monthly Quiz where students answered the questions quickly. It was to test their knowledge.




STAR ACHEIVERS IN THE FIELD OF KARATE YASHAS RAINA
