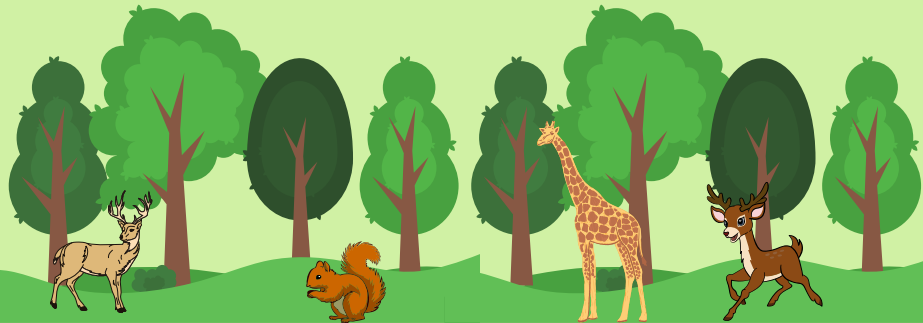


He who plants a tree, plants hope!”

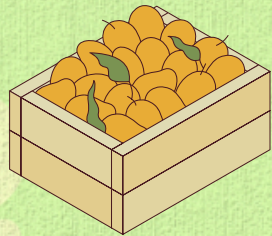
Mango Day

The activity was exciting as the children joyfully crafted colorful and creative rakhis

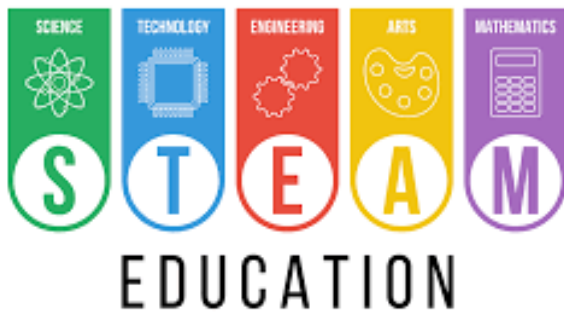
The children tied their handmade rakhis around the tree trunks symbolizing love and care for the environment .

This unique celebration not only sparked their creativity but also imparted values of love, care towards nature, and the joy of giving.

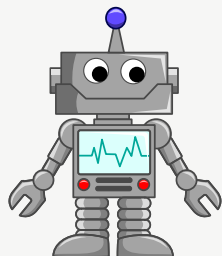


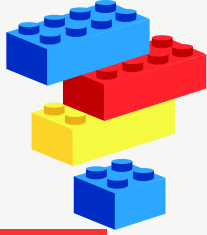

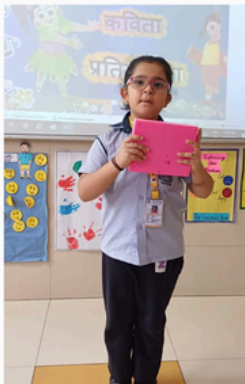


Hindi
