












Why **Dubai**



Overview of the personal statement

- Overview of the Personal Statement
- What is a Personal Statement?

A personal statement is your chance to tell universities why you're a strong candidate for the course you're applying to. It allows you to present your motivations, experiences, skills, and academic potential.

- Purpose of the Personal Statement:
- Showcase your enthusiasm and suitability for your chosen course.
- Highlight your academic and personal achievements.
- Stand out in the competitive admissions process.



Key Changes in the 2024 Format

• 1. Character Limit:

- UCAS personal statements now have a character limit of **4,000 characters** (previously 47 lines of text) which is about 2 sides of A4.
- This is roughly **500 words**.
- 2. Structure and Focus:
- UCAS guidelines recommend **clearer structure** with more focus on academic achievements and course motivation.
- 3. Emphasis on "Why this Course?" and "What Have You Done?"
- Universities are looking for specifics: why this subject? How have your experiences prepared you for the course? What skills do you bring?
- Note:- The new personal statement changes only affect students starting Year 12 in September 2024, or those looking to start university in September 2026).



Question 1

- Why Do You Want to Study This Course/Subject?
- Focus: Explain your passion for the subject and your long-term goals.
- Tips:
 - Discuss what excites you about the subject area.
 - Link personal interests or experiences that sparked your desire to study this course.
 - Mention any specific aspects of the course that appeal to you (e.g., modules, teaching methods, career opportunities).



Question 2

- How Have Your Qualifications and Studies Helped You Prepare for This Course or Subject?
- Focus: Highlight how your academic background has equipped you for the challenges of the course.
- Tips:
 - Discuss relevant subjects or coursework and how they relate to your chosen degree.
 - Highlight key skills you've developed, such as critical thinking, research, and problem-solving.
 - Mention specific achievements or projects that demonstrate your academic readiness.



Question 3

- What Else Have You Done to Prepare Outside of Education, and Why Are These Experiences Useful?
- Focus: Show how your extracurricular activities or work experience have complemented your academic preparation.
- Tips:
 - Include any volunteer work, part-time jobs, internships, or online courses that are relevant.
 - Explain how these experiences have helped you develop transferable skills (e.g., teamwork, communication, leadership).
 - Show a well-rounded profile by demonstrating your commitment and initiative.



General Tips for writing an effective statement

- 1. Be Specific & Focused:
- Avoid generic phrases like "I've always been interested in..."
- Provide concrete examples and real experiences.
- 2. Show, Don't Just Tell:
- Instead of just saying you're passionate about the subject, describe instances that demonstrate your passion (e.g., relevant coursework, projects, or independent learning).
- 3. Be Honest & Authentic:
- Don't exaggerate your experiences. Be sincere about your interests, achievements, and goals.
- 4. Avoid Clichés:
- Phrases like "I've always wanted to be a doctor" don't add value. Be original and specific.
- 5. Proofread!
- Ensure your personal statement is free of spelling, grammar, and punctuation errors.
- Ask someone else to review your statement for clarity and impact.



Common pitfalls to avoid

• 1. Repeating Your CV:

- Your personal statement should not be a copy of your CV. Instead, explain how your experiences relate to your course.
- 2. Being Too Vague or Overly General:
- Avoid a "catch-all" approach. Tailor the statement to each specific course or university.
- 3. Mentioning Money or Prestige:
- Focus on academic and personal reasons for choosing the course, not financial incentives or rankings.
- 4. Writing a Generic Introduction:
- The opening should be compelling and unique. Avoid overused phrases.
- 5. Plagiarism
- UCAS scans all personal statements through a similarity detection system to compare them with previous statements.
- Any similarity greater than 30% will be flagged and we'll inform the universities and colleges to which you have applied.


