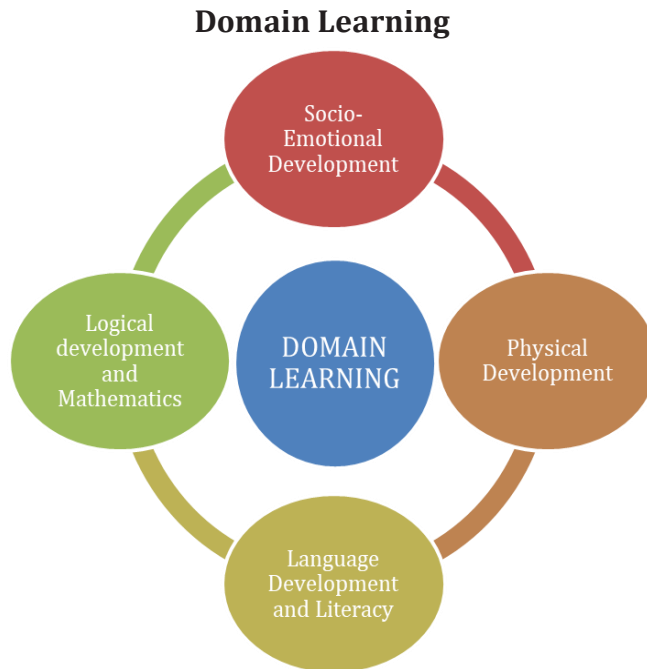


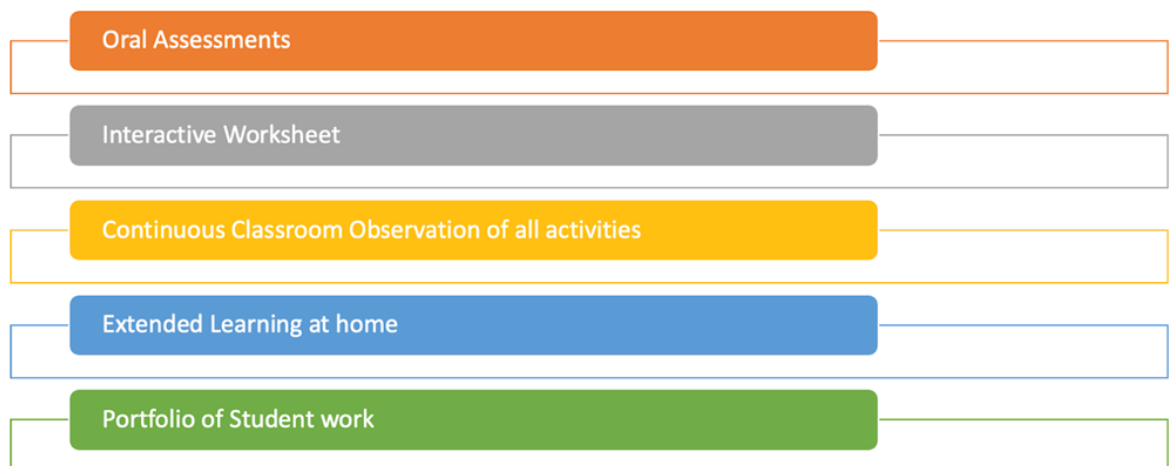
ASSESSMENT POLICY GRADE (NURSERY- II)

2. A maximum of 10 marks grace can be awarded for upto 2 subjects for promotion. A maximum of 5 marks grace can be awarded for one subject. Grace marks and compartment cannot be awarded together to a student.
