

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# PRINCIPAL'S DESK

In our pursuit of academic excellence and building a strong value system in our students we have thoughtfully curated a curriculum with a diverse array of activities. Renewed hope and commitment to achieve new goals and milestones drive us to revisit the action plan.

Training towards self-discipline is the core value in accomplishing the objectives we set for our students. Dwayne Johnson has rightly said, "All successes begin with self-discipline". Collective efforts are needed to nurture this important virtue and enable students to become responsible and resilient adults.

We live in a time and age where excessive use of gadgets and social media platforms has distanced students from their roots and reality. Studies and surveys by the WHO reveal a sharp rise in problematic social media use among adolescents, with rates increasing from 7% in 2018 to 11% in 2022. This, coupled with findings that 12% of adolescents are at risk of problematic gaming, raises urgent concerns about the addictive use of digital technology. Countries like Sweden and Denmark which announced a five-year digitalization strategy for schools in 2017 as their main educational objective, have reverted to traditional teaching methods due to the degrading mental health and emotional well-being of the students.

Distractions and influences will be many but, it is our bounded duty to direct our children to the right actions and choices. The controlled use of social media, gaming gadgets, and television viewing should be monitored from an early age. Children will ultimately learn to set their own boundaries, which can be achieved through consistent supervision, guidance, and counselling. This approach plays an indispensable role in protecting them from distress, stress, and depression.

We as stewards of these young minds need to understand our roles well. Micromanaging and an overbearing attitude can do more harm than good. We have to be empathetic and patient to seek out their thoughts, worries and challenges while they navigate through a crucial stage of their lives. Giving them privacy, guided autonomy and respect is extremely important but at the same time, we should not be scared to say 'NO' when it concerns their safety and health. There is no space for compromise or being overwhelmed by our love for them. Communication is key. Simply having a conversation daily, leads to stronger bonds with our wards. Striking the balance between trust and guidance is necessary to raise emotionally strong individuals.

Hope and peace in one's heart are essential ingredients in shaping these bright students into well-rounded individuals. Let us unite our efforts in giving our children a safe and secure life.


