

# BRIEF UPDATE OF THE SCHOOL CAMPUS ACTIVITIES

#### COMICS & GRAPHICS WORKSHOP ORGANISED.

A two-day workshop was organised on 30th and 31st August at Shiksha Valley School. The programme was conducted by Ms. Parismita Singh and Ms. Banamalika Choudhury.

Parismita Singh is a writer and graphic novelist. Her publication include the graphic novels, "The Hotel at the End of the World" and "Mara and the Clay Cows".

This workshop was an opportunity for students to work on creativity and expression. It gave an excellent space for the budding writers of our school.

At the end of the workshop children illustrated their imagination in a brilliant comic format. The training was excellent and children had great exposure.



# STORY TELLING SESSION BY CHITRALEKHABHASKAR



A story telling session was held on 29th August by the acclaimed story teller Chitralekha Bhaskar from Kolkata.

Story telling is a universal and traditional art form that has featured strongly in Indian culture as an effective communication tool. It can be used to inform, entertain and educate. It is often used as a medium to ingrain values, improving reading skills and opening the minds of children to worlds beyond imagination.

A workshop for story-telling was organized for students. It was indeed valuable and distinct. Children found it really interesting and engrossed in the stories which was told to them with creative gestures and facial expressions.

The appropriate use of voice modulation and body language infused passion, enhanced imagination and expression and introduced children to new horizons of storytelling. It was an interactive session where children were taught the right way of telling the stories. Overall this session helped the young souls for creative thinking.

#### LIBRARY WORKSHOP

A two-day Library workshop was organized by Shiksha Valley School on 21st and 22nd September, 2018, to promote reading habits among the school students. Conducted by Ms. Risha Barooah from Guwahati, the workshop was intended for teachers as well, to guide them on various aspects of a good library and how to utilize a library effectively for facilitating reading habits among children. Risha Barooah is the founder of North East Educational Trust, a registered charitable trust since 2009. She is in charge of a library programme that provides support in setting up libraries in government schools, conducting regular library sessions and facilitating workshops on library education and for educators and librarians. Her interests and research work lies in exploring and practising alternative methods of teaching and learning. She has been involved in developing curriculum, teaching children and mentoring teachers. Her workshop at Shiksha Valley School started off with a talk on the importance of book reading following an activity that initiated teachers to discuss in pairs their favourite books. The activity was thoroughly enjoyed by teachers as it focused on eliciting information and vocabulary development.



The workshop also included many other funfilled activities like reading aloud, genre card activity, read along etc.

The second day of the workshop gave more opportunity to students to explore their capabilities and hidden talents. They were given ample exposure to the world of books. The teachers on the other hand had a great time playing dumb charades on book names - a game that was initiated by the trainer herself. This was followed by group activities that involved discussions on themes and genres of books and their basic differences. The workshop for the teachers concluded with a mock book auction in which every bidder was given a set of ten sketch pens to bid with. The two-day workshop was highly informative as well as engaging. The students enjoyed the workshop immensely and the teachers felt highly motivated by the end of the workshop.

#### FROM FLORIDA WITH WARMTH

A group of 16 students headed by two professors from the University of South Florida (USF), Tampa, USA, who were on a 'Study Abroad' programme here, visited the Shiksha Valley School on 17th May, 2018 and interacted with our students. Former Principal, DHSK Commerce College, Mrs. Kalpana Khound delivered an enlightening speech on the importance of caring for Mother Nature. She planted a sapling in the school campus.

## WORKSHOP ON 'NEW DEVELOPMENTS IN BIO-TECH'

A workshop on 'New developments in Bio-tech' was conducted on 29th August by Dr. Gita Mehra from DAV College, Chandigarh. She narrated the journey of Biotechnology from the Biology lab to the Robotics lab. Biotechnology is technology based on biology, more so when used in agriculture, food science, and medicine. It is also used often to refer to genetic engineering technology.

Before the 70s, the term was mostly used in the food processing and agriculture industries. Later it began to be used by the Western scientific establishment to describe laboratory-based techniques involved in biological research like recombinant DNA or tissue culture-based processes etc. Biotechnology is a mix of many disciplines like genetics, molecular biology, biochemistry and embryology and cell biology. These are



again linked to practical disciplines like chemical engineering, information technology and bio-robotics.

The session was concluded by demonstration of foldscope among students. A Foldscope is an optical microscope that can be assembled from simple components including a sheet of paper and a lens. It was developed by Manu Prakash. It is part of the "frugal science" movement which aims to make cheap and easy tools available for scientific use in the developing world.

## YOGA DAY CELEBRATION

Shiksha Valley School celebrated International Yoga day on 21st June in which the students and teachers along with staff members of Income tax department performed various Asanas and Pranayams.

# LANGUAGE LAB & COMPUTER LAB INAUGURATED

#### ROBOTICS LAB INAUGURATED

Dr.Paramananda Sonowal, Jt. Registrar, Dibrugarh University inaugurated our school's Robotics lab on 1st September, 2018.

This will bring our students closer to Science and Engineering. It is the branch of technology that deals with the design, construction and application of robots and computer systems for their control, sensory feedback and information processing.

These technologies deal with automated machines that can take the place of humans in hazardous or manufacturing processes or simply just resemble humans. Robotics is a part of the curriculum starting from class III.

Well-trained teachers are the important contributing factor of School effectiveness and quality of learning. The main objective of the workshop was capacity building of teachers. The workshop was conducted by Sri. Bibhashjyoti Deshmukh and Smt. Nabanita Deshmukh from Puducherry.

#### 1ST TO 4TH AUGUST, 2018

The four-day training largely focussed on pedagogy and perspectives of education. It also dealt with challenges faced by teachers while dealing with students of nursery, primary and upper primary sections. The facilitators interacted with teachers of different standards and subjects through a series of activities, films, games and songs, classroom observations and demos to suggest innovative ways of learning.



#### ENGLISH &CROSS CURRICULUM

After an initial game of introductions, a discussion took place on why English is important for all teachers irrespective of what they teach because most subjects are taught in that language. A Book box film on Mahatma Gandhi's Salt March was shown Where the text simultaneously ran alongside the narration and every word was highlighted. This was done to make readers notice the text by developing good listening and reading skills. It also brought into focus how subjects like History, Geography, Math's, Science and Languages could be taught by choosing appropriate audio-visual resources.



#### VOCABULARY ENHANCEMENT

#### **Observation Walk**

The main objective of the workshop was to demonstrate how new words and concepts could be introduced to students. The teachers were guided into creating activities for children to explore 'the outside of the classroom'. Later, strategies on how to reinforce concepts and words newly learned were discussed. These included bringing in real objects into the classroom and using peer-learning to motivate children.

#### **Creative Writing Class**

The facilitator conducted a creative writing class for students of standard 6 on listening skills. A story of how a little mouse saves a lion was played and children had to answer questions about the story and become aware of words connected to sounds such as roar, snore, deafening etc. The class participated enthusiastically in the activity and enjoyed the class.
