ITL Public School paid a solemn tribute to World Heritage Day on 17 April, 2025 to honour the rich cultural and linguistic diversity that makes our nation a kaleidoscope of traditions and heritage. **An Inter House Tableau presentation was organized featuring the states of Odisha, Assam, Maharashtra, and Punjab.** The event was inaugurated by our esteemed Principal, Dr Sudha Acharya with lighting of the lamp. The Special Guest for this event was Dr Annie Koshi, Principal St Mary's Convent, Safdarjung Enclave. The event was aimed at embracing multilingualism, thereby fostering a deeper understanding and respect between different cultures, nurturing social cohesion and harmony. The students undertook a Journey through India's cultural mosaic by each house representing a particular state.

Pragati House – Assam

Pragati House proudly presented Assam – “the Land of Red Rivers and Blue Hills” – capturing the essence of this beautiful state nestled in the lush greenery of North east India. Renowned for its cultural heritage, exotic wildlife, aromatic tea gardens and the warmth of its people, Assam exemplifies the harmony of nature’s bounty. As representatives of this vibrant land, students of Pragati House presented a journey of its colorful festivals, soulful music, dynamic dance forms, and exquisite art. Adorned in traditional Mekhela Chadors and Gamochas, the house celebrated the spirit of Bihu. Famous cuisines – Pitika Platter, Poita Bhat, Bilahi Tenga, Coconut Laddoo, Poka Mithoi were prepared by the students. The tableau paid tribute to Assam’s artistic brilliance, from handwoven silks to intricate bamboo and cane craftsmanship, showcasing the creativity of Assam.

Pratibha House – Odisha

Pratibha House showcased Odisha's cultural and natural heritage featuring traditional art forms like Pattachitra Paintings, Pipili Appliqué Work, and Sambalpuri textiles. Students performed classical Odissi dance and folk song. They narrated the historical importance of architectural marvels like Konark Sun Temple and Jagannath Temple. The authentic Odishan cuisines: Pakhala Bhata, Dalma, Chhena Poda, Rasabali prepared by the students enchanted all. The tableau provided a comprehensive glimpse into Odisha’s diverse traditions and natural wonders empowering students about India’s rich cultural heritage.

Prerna House - Punjab

Prerna House presented a vibrant tableau titled “Punjab – The Land of Five Rivers,” celebrating the state’s rich culture, history, and agricultural heritage. The display featured energetic folk dances like Bhangra and Giddha, traditional Punjabi music, and delicious dishes such as Sarson da Saag, Makki di Roti, Paneer Tikka and Mango Lassi. Iconic elements like the Golden Temple and tributes to freedom fighters reflected Punjab’s proud legacy. The tableau also highlighted Punjab’s role in the Green Revolution, while addressing key issues like stubble burning and groundwater depletion. Government schemes like PM – KISAN Yojana, crop diversification and sustainable farming methods were creatively showcased.

Prayas House – Maharashtra

The vibrant state of Maharashtra came alive through the tableau presentation of Prayas House showcasing its rich cultural heritage and traditions. Here all were greeted by the majestic presence of Lord Ganesha, the reverted deity. The tableau featured authentic handlooms and jewellery, reflecting the state's exquisite craftsmanship and models of iconic architectural masterpieces, including the ancient caves of Ajanta and Ellora.
