Poem- 4 If you think you can

Poetic Devices

- **Repetition** The phrase "If you think" is repeated at the beginning of each stanza, emphasizing the significance of one's thoughts and beliefs in determining actions and outcomes.
- **Rhyme Scheme** The poem follows a consistent AABB rhyme scheme, where each pair of lines rhymes.
- Metaphor- The poem metaphorically compares success to a battle, stating that life's battles don't always go to the stronger or faster man, but to the one who thinks he can.
- Alliteration The poem contains instances of alliteration, such as in the phrase "Success begins with a fellow's will," where the repetition of the 's' sound creates a pleasing auditory effect and emphasizes the importance of willpower in achieving success.
- **Personification** The poem primarily focuses on the power of individual mindset, it personifies success as something that "begins with a fellow's will," attributing human qualities to the concept of success to highlight its reliance on personal determination.
- Imagery- The poem uses vivid imagery, such as "Life's battles don't always go to the stronger or faster man," to paint a picture of life's challenges and the importance of mindset in overcoming them.
