Poetic Devices

1. Personification – When a non-living thing is given a characteristic of a living being.

eg- The poetry of earth

2. Repetition- Repeated use of words or phrases for emphasis.

eg-hedge

3. Transferred Epithet- The use of an adjective with a noun when it refers to another noun. eg- pleasant weed, winter evening

4. Alliteration- The repetition of consonant sounds at the beginning of words in close proximity. eg- he has, grasshopper's among some grassy hills.
