


Students of Classes I and II participated in a fun Memory Game called 'Hide and Seek' to reinforce their understanding of numbers and multiplication tables.

Adding to the charm of the event, the students of Classes I and II presented a heart-warming rendition of the song "Joy to the World". Their mellifluous performance left everyone in awe.


