Hope you all have enjoyed reading Read a thon books. Design an activity based on the book you have just read. The activity should be fun filled and creative.


Be an Author - Create Your Own Storybook!


3. Whole Numbers – "A Week with Numbers"

4. Wizard of Ops $(+, -, \times, \div)$



- Front of Postcard:


