Nannaya Bhattaraka, a pioneering figure in Telugu literature, is widely considered the "father of Telugu literature" for his translation of the Sanskrit epic Mahabharata into Telugu, marking the beginning of Telugu literature. Some famous literary figures in Telugu include Tikkana Somayaji, Errana, Vemana, Gurajada Apparao, Kandukuri Veeresalingam, and Viswanatha Satyanarayana.
