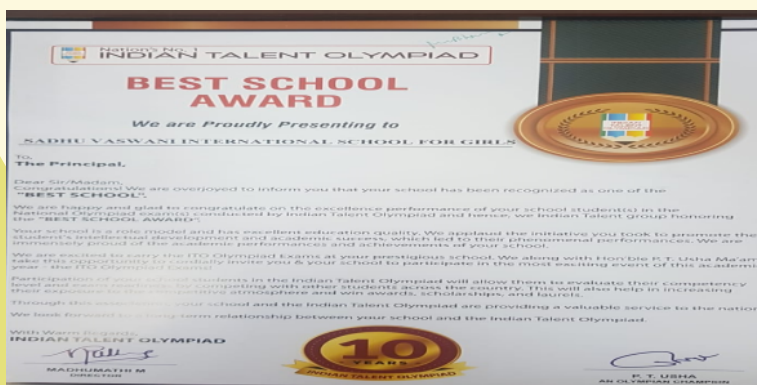
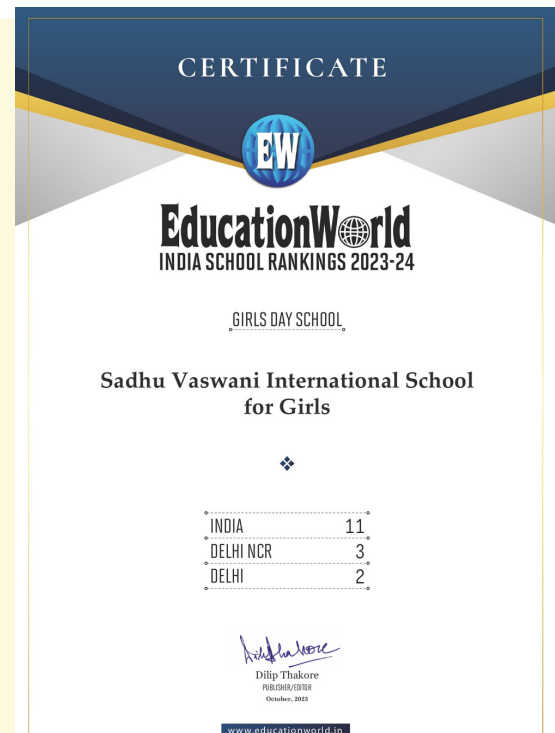
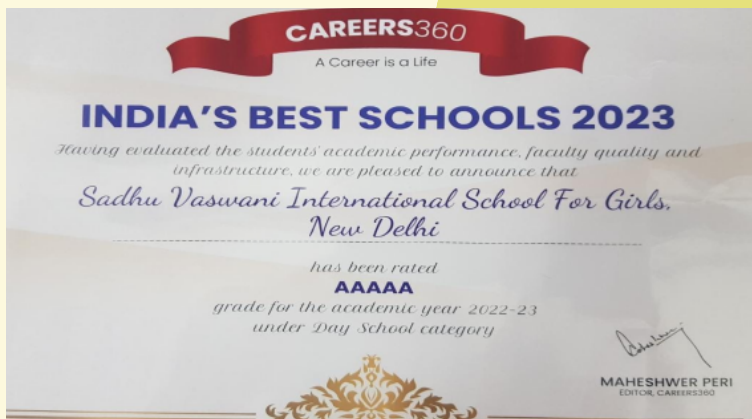
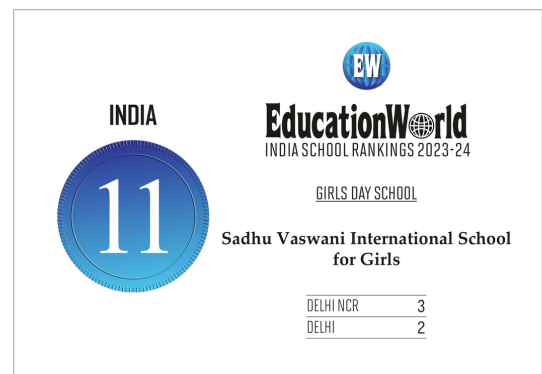
the audience with verses from the Anjali Granth.

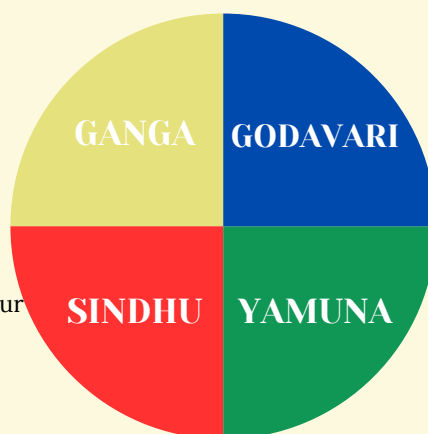

Annual Exhibition

Sadhu Vaswani International School for Girls has held another edition of SVISG Annual Exhibition (Senior School) on 19 August 2023 with great pride. With over 10 categories of exhibits, across various social trends and issues; especially acknowledging the importance of G20, the event was enriched with knowledge, innovative ideas and creativity.

English Exhibition welcomed the visitor with an eye-catching Global Literature Board containing information about various internationally famous authors. A group of students performed an ingenious dance choreography while rapping on G20. The exhibition also offered the visitors a reading corner which consisted of books published by the students and teachers themselves.

The visitors upon entering the Hindi and Sanskrit exhibition were immediately captivated by the vibrant colors of the wall magazines portraying the numerous facets of Indian culture. The students of the Hindi and Sanskrit exhibition managed to help the visitors remember to take pride in their extremely opulent heritage. The students of the Sindhi exhibition greeted the visitors with a Bhajan in Sindhi. The food stalls in the exhibition offered several Sindhi delicacies. The students of the French exhibition were dressed vibrantly in traditional outfits of various countries and presented a wholesome play on culture exchange programme. The wall magazine covered one of the major goals for G20 “Education For All”. They provided the visitors with a reading corner and had a comic strip dedicated to “The Superheroes of G20” on display. The Spanish Exhibition left the visitors with an eager urge to learn more about the luxurious Spanish culture with a skit and performance on famous Spanish songs enthralling the visitors.

The Maths Exhibition showcased multiple projects that interconnected Mathematics with daily life and G20. A still-model “Mathematics in Motion” encompassed the themes of G20 while comparing the disparities between developed and developing nations and how geometry impacted the transformation of these nations. One of the projects mentioned another important aspect of “Mighty Millets” as the year has been declared the International Year of Millets. Overall, the Mathematics Exhibition creatively intertwined G20 with the concepts of Mathematics.

The Social Studies Exhibition re-emphasized the importance of many ongoing projects in India including Digital India. There was a G20 photo book on display in the exhibition to even inform the younger visitors about the event in progress. There were many innovative projects based on sustainable development like-Affordable Energy, Water Harvesting, Art Stall, Artificial wetlands etc. The Commerce & Economics Exhibition focused on past agendas like financial stability, global health, terrorism etc and present agendas like G20, Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam, International Economic Cooperation etc simultaneously. It also managed to shed light on financial inclusion (“Fund the unfunded, bank the banked.”) and women’s empowerment.

The Science Exhibition had an awe-striking amount of displays consisting of both working and still-models. It focused on sustainable “cost-efficient” development and better quality of life. There were many viable, innovative and efficient projects like Vertical Farming, Smart Bridge with Soil Moisture Sensors, Laser Light Home Security etc. Some models also used best out of waste like Iron With Matchsticks which used the waste product ‘rust’, Vigyanveer- a microscope made using a plastic bottle, or Aspiradora-a vacuum cleaner made using recycled plastic etc.

The Psychology & Medical Exhibition created a floor to discuss many topics of taboo like mental health, child sexual abuse, underage consumption of drugs, organ donation etc. The Psychology students presented an impactful drama about child sexual abuse and the societal pressure on the parents to maintain their silence about it. On the other hand, the Medical students showcased a poignant skit covering several topics of importance like underage alcohol usage, addiction, lung cancer and organ donation.

The IT Exhibition engaged the visitors in the current technological trends of Artificial Intelligence and Coding. There were a great deal of projects based on different aspects of the latest technological advancements. The projects included an informative presentation on ChatGPT, Jarvis-an AI assistant made using Python, Gencraft-an image generator based on text, a Digital House Election made in CODE.ORG and a finger detection project created with AICONNECT having numerous future prospects.





ATL Tinkerfest Report – Session (2023–24)

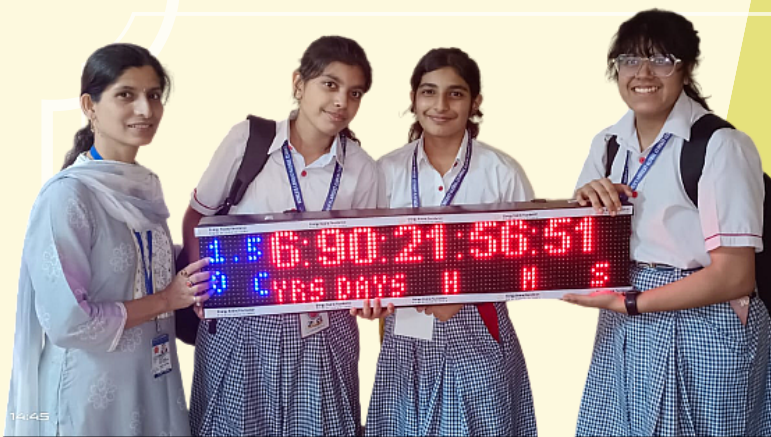
Students depicted their views by writing slogans through posters and poems. Eco-Club students from primary to senior school enthusiastically participated in the activity.



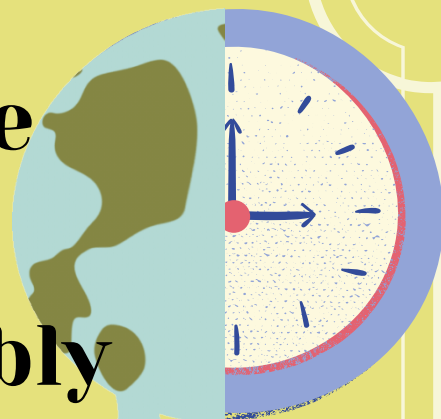
Tree Plantation Drive

Panel Discussion in National Science Centre

On 13th of April 2023, forty two students from classes 10, 11 and 12 along with two teachers had the opportunity to witness a panel discussion on Antimicrobial Resistance held at the National Science Centre, New Delhi. The event was hosted by Superheroes Against Superbugs (SaS) and World Animal Protection in collaboration with NSCD. The discussion aimed at creating awareness about Antibiotic Resistance (or AMR) and how it is impacting the food we eat and the impact of antibiotic resistance on humans, animal health and environment. It also threw light on the significance of collaboration between farmers, veterinarians, research and scientific organisations and other stakeholders in promoting responsible antibiotic use. It triggered students' thinking to explore more about the judicious use of antibiotics.



"Our Planet, Our Future"

Earth Day is celebrated on April 22 every year. The students of classes III-V enthusiastically participated in an Inter-House Poster Making competition to commemorate our benevolent Mother Earth. They depicted their views by drawing posters based on the theme 'Our Planet, Our Future'. Their thought provoking slogans conveyed a strong message to one and all about the little things we can do in order to take care of Earth- reduce the use of plastic bags and recycling waste stuff. Earth Day celebrations also included an educational presentation for senior classes. The assembly was informed about the expedient action necessary to reverse climate change and used the opportunity to cite some movements such as #TreesforEarth and #EndPlasticPollution which endeavored to preserve the environment. Furthermore a video was displayed that elaborated on past consequences of climate change such as rising temperatures, sea levels, loss of biodiversity etc, while citing positive tipping points such as increase in renewable technology, climate awareness and many more. The participants were addressed by Professor Pradeep Kumar Burma, Head, Department of Genetics and were motivated towards research work by learning about the regeneration of whole plants from somatic cells.

Wall Paintings at CBSE Centre of Excellence (CEO) Office

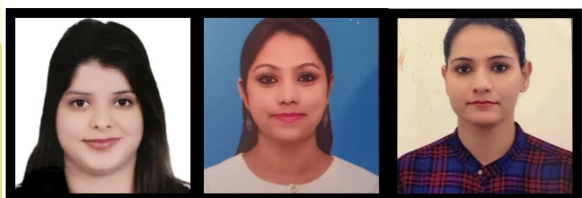
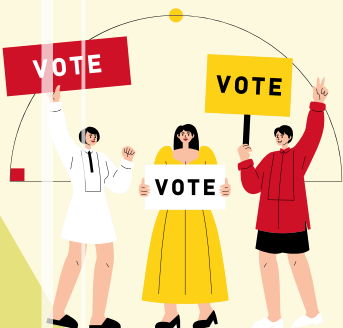

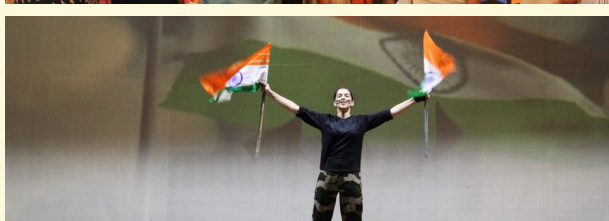
Learning Beyond the Classroom: School Excursions
