Educational Trip to Sariska

Throughout the trip, students participated in various team-building activities, such as group games and treasure hunts, fostering teamwork, problem-solving, and communication among peers.

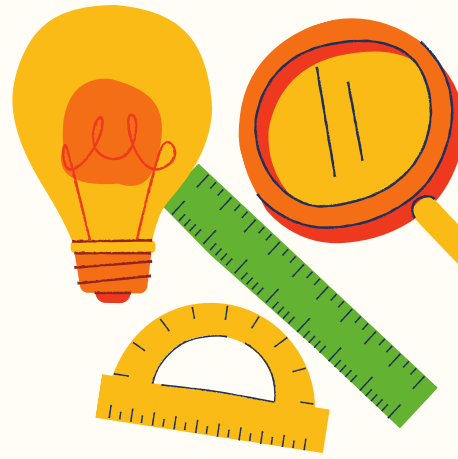
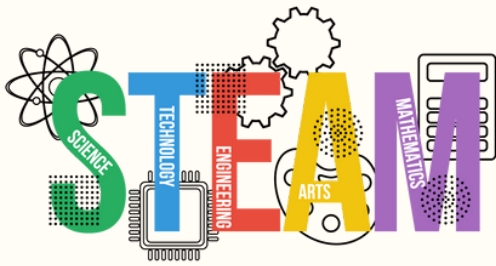

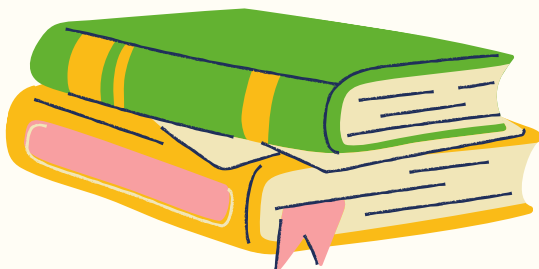
The STEAM Expo provided an exciting platform for learners to showcase their creativity, critical thinking, and innovative spirit through projects developed over the academic year.

Integrating Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics, the expo highlighted interdisciplinary learning in action.

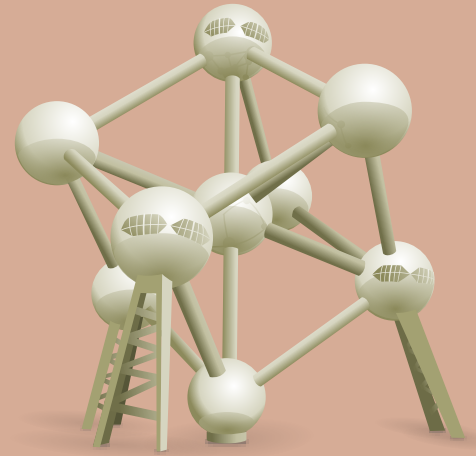

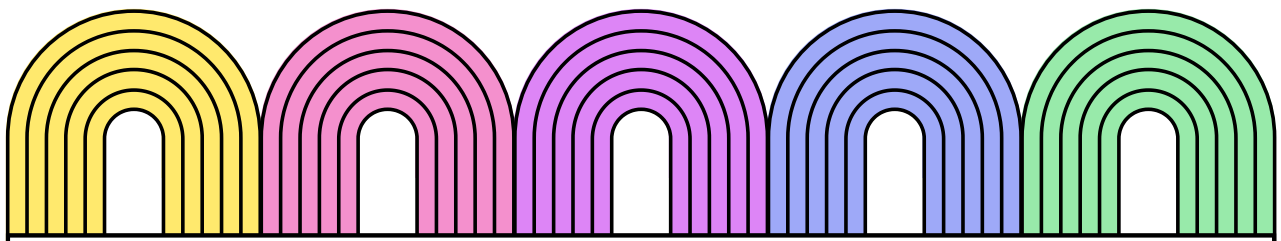

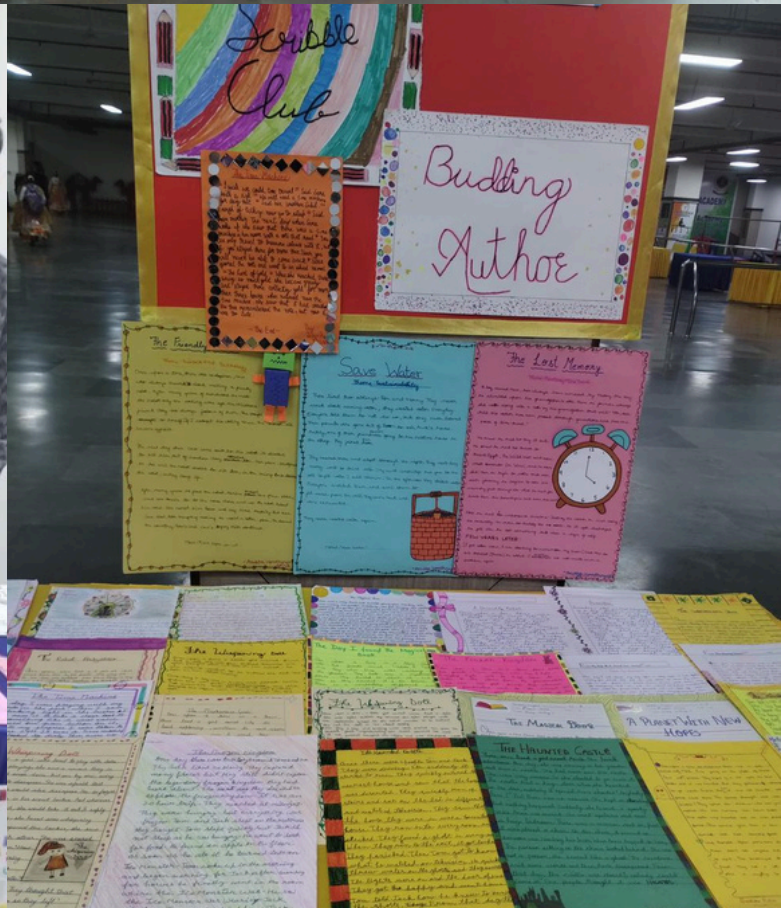
CLUB PRESENTATIONS

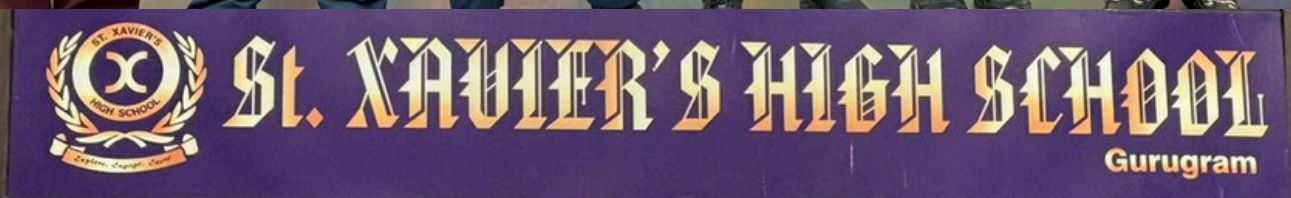
