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

It was heartening to witness students collaborating, experimenting, and problem-solving —developing 21st-century skills while having loads of fun!





The celebration reaffirmed the role of yoga in promoting physical, mental, and spiritual well-being, leaving everyone inspired to adopt a healthier lifestyle.












Celebrating India's Cultural Tapestry :SPIC MACAY art at Sec-89

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Earth Day Pledge









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VIII-A Assembly: 'Biocon's Beacon Kiran Mazumdar Shaw



















