UKG

The Holiday Homework focused on Holistic development of the little learners while keeping them close to nature. Children observed and described elements of nature and natural sounds, engaged with stories and media to build language and thinking skills, developed creativity and environmental awareness through reuse and nature-based crafts, strengthened fine motor and early math skills through hands-on activities, and grew in confidence and responsibility as they cared for themselves and the world around them.

CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMME



PRIMARY PLUS FOR EXTRA READING







TEACHER'S CORNER-VOICES THAT INSPIRE

<u>OPTIMAL BRAIN DEVELOPMENT IN EARLY CHILDHOOD</u>



The process of brain development begins in the 3rd week of gestation and continues into early adulthood, however, the first three years of a child's life are most crucial as these are the peak years of brain development and everything that happens to the child affects the brain and that in turn affects how he learns.

How the brain grows and works?

- A child is born with about 100 billion neurons not connected to functional networks.
- Endogenous and exogenous stimulation leads to 'neurons that fire together, wire together' developing long lasting synaptic connections which in turn develops the brain and enables the child to do complex activities and impacts quality of learning in later life.
- After the child is born, each neuron has 2500 synapses connecting it to other cells. But, by the time the child is 3 years old, his brain becomes a sponge of fascinating new information with synapses soaring to 6 times high with 700 synaptic connections being made every second.
- What is remarkable is that this rate of growth is not matched at any other time during child's life span so 'use this window of opportunity or lose it'. By the time we are adults we have half as many synapses as when we were three and so the first 3 years are known as the magic years due to rapid growth in sensory abilities of babies.

Gift of Neural Plasticity

- The brain possesses an amazing property to mould itself to new conditions, new learning. Brain is more plastic during first few years than it will ever be again in life. Learning alters the structure of the brain at cellular level which goes to form our memory.
- The brain cells change in different ways. As for school learning where we need to learn, relearn, remember and reuse the whole information, more the number of revisions, the stronger are the synaptic connections making learning better and reproduction faster. Whereas information not of much use is lost due to weak synaptic connections making it short term memory.

Why do parents need to focus on those early years?

- •Parents' job begins the moment the child is born and they need to know that it is important to catch them when they are young enough to benefit.
- •Parents are the MOST important people in a child's life during those early years. They can either impact the child positively or negatively in these early years. Whatever happens during this period actually goes into child's development in the middle years and later on affecting him/her for the life time.
- •The experiences and interactions the child has will lead to connections being formed in the brain cells. To impact the child positively, strong connections need to be formed by way of strong positive relationships. Relationships bring experiences. If they are negative and stressful then they would actually hurt those connections and influence brain development adversely.

TEACHER'S CORNER-VOICES THAT INSPIRE

OPTIMAL BRAIN DEVELOPMENT IN EARLY CHILDHOOD

What can Parents do to nurture a child's brain?

- •Focus on kids much before they get into school.
- •Secured attachment & relationships This is most important in a child's life and it comes from a parent who is extremely responsive, especially at a time when the child is stressed. Lack of response all the time from the parents is not a good situation. It could effect a child's relation with other people as well.
- •Play with babies and respond immediately to their stress. Observe the baby and pick up on your baby's cues.
- •Create language rich environment. Joint family or grandparents are a buffer or protective factors.
 •Lack of relationships leads to low self-esteem in the child, more so because they are not verbal at this stage.
- •This deprivation affects their behavior later in school, impacts their ability to learn, inquisitiveness and ability to cope in a class of 25-30.

The Dance of life

- •Genes and environment are absolutely inextricable partners in this dance of life.
- •Genes supply the rough blue print and then stimulation from the environment, whether a light impinging on the retina or a mother's voice on the auditory nerve, turn genes on and off.
- •Till the age 6 the stimulation has to be enriching and frequent as this is the period when the synapses are extensive. It clearly points to the vulnerability of the 1st six years which is determined by the environment surrounding a child



Brain during 3-6 years age

- Much evidence confirms that after the age of three, brain is sponge-like ready to acquire new skills rapidly.
- •Rear base of thecerebellum is all set forwell-coordinated play activities and finemotor skills.
- •The inner brain structure, hippocampus, undergoes maturation and well connected to the frontal lobe thus enhancing spatial understanding for cognitive learning and the connections between the two hemispheres are strengthened by increased myelination.
- •Production of synapses is at peak facilitating attention, memory, language, and problem solving and thinking. Hence everything that goes around the child impacts his brain, everything he sees, hears, touches, smells builds up connections in the brain cells.
- •Specifically planned enriched learning experiences given at this stage help in acquiring specific learning competencies such as reading, writing, singing, dancing, playing musical instruments, swimming etc with great ease.

These enhanced insights into the linkages of brain and process of early development caution us as to how to protectour little ones from experiences that have seriouslifelong consequences and at the same time give them the best they deserve for realizing their potential.
