#### 1. ATTENDANCE

Every student must have a minimum of **75% attendance**, failing which he/she will not be allowed to sit in the final examination/will not be promoted to the next higher class, as per the CBSE guidelines.

Please discourage the student from missing an exam unless on grounds of extreme Medical Emergency for which a medical certificate from a certified government hospital

Practitioner and supporting medical reports must be submitted to the same day till 8:30AM.

# PROMOTION POLICY AND CUMULATIVE RESULT

# **PASSING CRITERIA**

- 1. In the scholastic area, a student needs to secure 33% marks (both pen and Paper Test & Internal Assessment taken together) to be able to pass that subject. The promotion is also subject to the condition that a minimum 33% marks should be secured in Annual Examination.
- 2. A student scoring less than 33% in more than 2 subjects will be: detained. Retest is permitted in a maximum of 2 subjects only.

- 3. If a student fails in any one of the three elective subjects (i.e. Science, Mathematics and Social Science) and passes in the skill subject (offered as 6<sup>th</sup> additional subject) then that subject will be replaced by the skill subject and the result will be computed accordingly. If a student fails in any one language (Subject 1&2) and passes in the third language (offered as 6<sup>th</sup> additional subject) then that language will be replaced by the third language.
- 4. The aggregate of best five including English will be considered for calculating the percentage.
- 5. It is mandatory for a student to pass the additional subject in class IX <u>as per passing criteria to be promoted to class X...</u> For students who are unable to meet the passing criteria, a <u>retest will be conducted</u>. For the promotion to class X, it is essential to get 33% in all 6 subjects.

#### **GRACE MARKS**

- 1. Grace marks up to maximum of 10 in all, shall be awarded to a student to reach the minimum required 33% of marks in each subject, provided that a minimum of 25% of marks are secured in each subject in the Annual Examination to make him/her eligible for promotion, provided he/she does not require more than 05 marks in one subject to come up to the minimum required of 33% of marks in that subject. However, no grace marks shall be awarded to a student in the Compartment Examination.
- 2. Grace marks may be given in any subject(s) after the replacement of any one language/subject (in case of failing in any language /subject) by the third language/skill subject..
- 3. In case, total 10 grace marks are not awarded in the five main subjects then rest of grace marks may be awarded to the Skill Subject/ third language for making him qualify to appear in Board Exam, if required.

# **Re-Examination/ Compartment (Class-IX)**

- 1. A student scoring less than 33% in 2 subjects will be permitted to take Retest in those subjects. The retest will be conducted within a month of Annual Examination.
- 2. The compartment examination will be conducted on the same pattern of Annual Examination i.e three hours duration and 80 marks.
- 3. Maximum two retests will be conducted.

### Missed Test / Exams

- 1. <u>If a student remains absent in any of the UTs then</u> the one for which he has appeared will be counted for the assessment and proportionate marks will be allotted for the other.
- 2. For promotion minimum 2 pen & paper testduring the academic session is mandatory along with Annual exam. .
- 3. In any other specific case, the decision will rest with the school promotion committee.

### **Class XI Stream Allotment**

- 1. For class XI streams will be allotted on the basis of class X Pre-Board marks.
- 2. 5% concession of marks will be given to the NCC cadets (an A level certificate or 2 years NCC Enrolment) and the National Level Sports players.
- 3. No subject change request will be entertained after 30<sup>th</sup> May.
