

Dear Readers.



### **PUPPET SHOW**



### **Creative Hands at Work**


### **POTTERY FUN**

आज कक्षा में कुछ खास हुआ... जब सपने वाले काका' कविता के साथ आए, तो बच्चों की आंखों में सपनों की चमक भर गई। कविता पढ़ने से पहले, काका ने बच्चों को एक पर्ची दी — एक छोटा सा आमंत्रण. अपने दिल के सबसे प्यारे सपने को शब्दों में ढालने का। बच्चों ने न केवल अपने सपनों को लिखा. बल्कि अपने परिवार के हर सदस्य से भी बात की — \*"मां, आपका सपना क्या है?"\* \*"दादी, आपने क्या सपना देखा था कभी?"\* और इस संवाद से जो भावनाओं का झरना फूटा, उसने कक्षा को एक संवेदनशील और भावनात्मक धागों में पिरो दिया। फिर आई SEA एक्टिविटी — बच्चों ने अपने सपनों को रंगों, शब्दों और प्रतीकों में पिरोकर मिलकर बनाया — "सपनों का पेड़"एक ऐसा पेड़, जिसमें सिर्फ पत्तियाँ नहीं, सपनों की उडानें थीं...जहां हर टहनी किसी की आशा थी. हर पत्ती एक ख्वाब।इस गतिविधि ने बच्चों को सिर्फ बोलना और लिखना नहीं सिखाया —बल्कि सुनना,समझना,और सृजन करना भी सिखाया।यह केवल एक शैक्षणिक कार्य नहीं था, यह एक भावनात्मक यात्रा थी — दिलों को जोड़ने और बच्चों की कल्पनाओं को पंख देने की।

कक्षा 5 के विद्यार्थियों को सर्वनामऔर उसके भेदों को रोचक और व्यावहारिक तरीके से समझाने के लिए एक प्रभावपूर्ण पूर्व गतिविधि आयोजित की गई। इस गतिविधि में कक्षा को तीन समूहों में बाँटा गया। सभी बच्चे खेल के मैदान में एक विशेष रूप से तैयार किए गए स्थान पर ले जाए गए जहाँ एक बडी टोकरी में विभिन्न शब्दों की पर्चियाँ रखी गई थीं। प्रत्येक समूह को निर्धारित समय के भीतर उन शब्दों को छाँटकर उचित सर्वनाम के भेद\* के अंतर्गत सही स्थान पर रखना था। इस प्रक्रिया में बच्चों को शब्दों को पढ़ना, उनका अर्थ समझना और उनके भेद को पहचानते हुए सही स्थान पर लगाना था। यह गतिविधि बच्चों के लिए न केवल ज्ञानवर्धक सिद्ध हुई बल्कि उनमें टीमवर्क, निर्णय क्षमता और पूर्व ज्ञान की पुनरावृत्ति\* को भी प्रोत्साहित किया। बच्चों ने पूरे उत्साह से भाग लिया और अपनी समझ का रचनात्मक उपयोग किया। इस रोचक अभ्यास से यह स्पष्ट हुआ कि बच्चे न केवल विषयवस्तु को समझ रहे हैं, बल्कि उसे व्यवहार में भी उतार पा रहे हैं।

### Heartfelt poems about the IMPORTANCE OF FRIENDSHIP



### **Reducing Waste, Serving Humanity**

To raise awareness about hunger and food security, a Multiple Assessment activity was conducted in Grade VIII Social Science on preventing food wastage and exploring the role of community kitchens. The activity was initiated in light of India's poor ranking in the Global Hunger Index 2024, where it stood at a disappointing 111th position out of 125 countries, reflecting the urgency of addressing food insecurity. Students were informed that approximately 4000 children under the age of five die daily in India due to hunger and malnutrition. This shocking reality motivated them to think critically and act responsibly. Students reflected on: Causes and consequences of food wastage. Practical strategies to reduce wastage at home and school. The concept of 'Model Community Kitchens', where surplus food is collected, stored safely, and distributed to the needy.

### **Exploring the Mauryan Empire through Map Work**

Grade VII students actively participated in a subject enrichment activity aimed at understanding the vast extent of the Mauryan Empire. Through detailed map work, students identified and marked major cities and towns such as Pataliputra, Taxila, Ujjain, Kalinga, and Sanchi, which were significant during the Mauryan period. This hands-on activity helped students visualize the territorial reach and strategic importance of various regions under Emperor Ashoka's rule. It enhanced their geographical awareness and historical understanding, making the learning experience more engaging and meaningful.
