## PRACTICE BEFORE THE MAIN EVENT



### UNCSW

#### Combating Gender-Based Violence & Deepfakes

The United Nations Commission on the Status of Women, chaired by Ms. Neekita Bablani, with Ms. Kriti Pathak as Vice-Chair and Ms. Angel Kapoor as Rapporteur, saw passionate debates on gender-based violence and the rise of deepfake misuse. Delegates came well-prepared with facts, examples, and innovative solutions to safeguard women's rights globally. They discussed policies that balance law enforcement with awareness campaigns and the role of technology in prevention. The committee reflected deep commitment and empathy, as every delegate worked with sincerity to address an issue impacting millions worldwide. ### UNSC

### SAARC

#### Refugee Crisis & Human Rights


