Project-Portfolio/Project Report

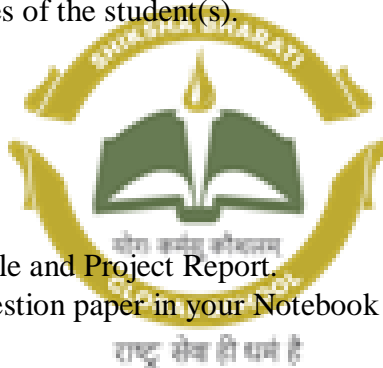
The Project-Portfolio may include the following :

1. A government budget shows a fiscal deficit. The government is considering two options to finance this deficit:

* Option A: Borrowing from the public and commercial banks.

* Option B: Printing new currency (deficit financing).

Analyze both options, explaining the economic implications of each on the Indian economy. Which option would be more beneficial and why?

2. The government decides to increase its expenditure on a new highway project and funds it by imposing a new tax on luxury cars. Analyze how this budgetary policy can help in achieving the objective of redistribution of income and reallocation of resources in the economy.

3. A government budget shows a high revenue deficit. Explain the implications of this deficit and suggest three measures that the government can take to reduce it.

4. Explain the various components of a government budget. What is the significance of the distinction between revenue budget and capital budget?

5. "Fiscal deficit is a measure of the government's borrowing requirements." Elaborate on this statement and explain the implications of a high fiscal deficit on the economy.

6. Define revenue deficit and primary deficit. What is the significance of the difference between the two?

7. Explain how a government budget can be used to achieve the objective of economic stability. What is the role of the budget in controlling inflationary and deflationary situations?

8. Differentiate between autonomous and accommodating transactions in the Balance of Payments. Explain the significance of this distinction.

9. Explain the various components of the Capital Account of the Balance of Payments. What is its role in correcting a deficit in the Current Account?

10. Explain the difference between Balance of Trade and Balance of Payments. Why is it said that the Balance of Payments always balances, but the Balance of Trade can be in surplus or deficit?

11. Differentiate between a fixed exchange rate system and a flexible exchange rate system. Which system, in your opinion, is better and why?

12. "A persistent Balance of Payments deficit is a cause for concern for any economy." Justify the statement and suggest two policy measures to correct it.

13. A global financial crisis leads to a sharp reduction in foreign capital inflows into a country. Analyze the impact on the country's capital account and exchange rate.

14. The Balance of Payments is often described as an "accounting statement." What does this mean, and what is the role of the Official Reserves Account in this context?

15. Explain the major sources of demand and supply of foreign exchange.
