# EDITORIAL MESSAGE




Greetings to the fellow readers and welcome to the new edition of the magazine 2024-2025 Vol. 1!







**NET ZERO BUILDING CHALLENGE**





# **CONSTRUCTION YARD SESSION**

## FOSTERING INCLUSIVITY: FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM ON UNIVERSAL DESIGN

The MBS College conducted a five-day online Faculty Development Program (FDP) from January 6th to 10th, 2025, centered on the theme "Integrating Universal Design to Foster Inclusive and Accessible Environments." This enriching event brought together esteemed speakers, including Ar. Shivani Shah, a Neurodiversity Accessibility Consultant; Dr. Kavita Murugkar, a Universal Design Expert; and Ms. Smitha Sadasivan, a Disability Rights Activist.

The program began by challenging stereotypes and fostering empathy for diverse user needs, emphasizing the importance of inclusive design thinking. Legal perspectives accessibility, delivered by Ms. Sadasivan, highlighted the significance of understanding laws and their real-world enforcement. 
#### **INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION**



The celebration was a meaningful reminder of the importance of creativity in engineering and technology, leaving everyone inspired and connected to the legacy of Lord Vishwakarma.


















