




AN ENCHANTING JANMASHTAMI READING SESSION


TEACHER'S CORNER-VOICES THAT INSPIRE

SHOULD WE REALLY CALL CHILDREN 'SMART' OR SAY 'EXCELLENT' FOR EVERYTHING?

We all know how harmful negative labels like "slow" or "not so bright" can be for children. But what about the positive ones—calling them "smart," "gifted," or saying "excellent" for every piece of work? While it seems encouraging, it may not be doing our children as much good as we think.



What truly nurtures growth is specific, sincere feedback: "You worked hard on this" or "Your handwriting has improved" helps children recognize the value of effort and progress.

Every child is unique, with limitless potential waiting to be explored. Let's encourage them to embrace challenges, learn from mistakes, and discover the joy of genuine achievement—without being bound by labels or empty praise.

Labels—whether flattering or not —can make children define themselves only through that tag. When they are repeatedly called "smart," they often feel pressured to keep proving it. This fear of losing approval can make them hesitant to try new or challenging tasks, robbing them of the lessons that come from making mistakes.

Similarly, praising every average "very good" effort with "excellent" can blur a child's sense of what true excellence looks like. If everything is labelled "good," there's little motivation to higher. strive Even corrections, if a teacher marks average work as "good," the child assumes that is their best and stops aiming for improvement.

THE MAGIC OF MORNING ASSEMBLIES


Morning assemblies are one of the most important events of our school day. They are not just about standing in lines or speaking on the stage; they are about starting the day with purpose and discipline.

As we conclude every assembly with the school song and the national anthem, students feel proud to be a part of the school and their country.




More than anything, morning assemblies are a time for connection, for students, teachers, and the Director-Principal. It is a daily ritual that binds us together and reminds us that we are one school family.
