The Ganguly family visited the **Sundarbans** forest. This place is muddy and salty because the river meets the sea. Rohan saw trees with special **breathing roots** that stick up from the mud. The guide said these roots also act like nets to **hold the soil** tightly, which stops the land from washing away. This forest is home to the **Royal Bengal Tiger** and many other animals. Local people live carefully here and collect things like honey.

- a) Identify the type of tree found in Sundarbans, and state one way its special roots help it survive in the muddy area. Mangrove tree; its breathing roots(pneumatophores) help it take in air in the muddy soil.
