IGI Becomes India's First Water-Positive Airport

December 2, 2025

Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGI) has earned the title of India's first water-positive airport among facilities handling more than 40 million passengers annually. Being water-positive means the facility replenishes more freshwater than it consumes. IGI achieved this goal by expanding rainwater harvesting, investing in storage systems and adopting advanced recycling mechanisms. This certification marks a milestone in sustainable airport operations and environmental stewardship.

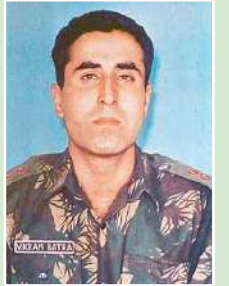

Living a very comfortable life, we often forget that this life doesn't come to us for free. There are some men in uniform giving their sweat and blood 24×7 for us to live that way. For their supreme acts of bravery, cold courage and devotion to duty, they were also decorated with the Param Vir Chakra, the highest Indian gallantry award.

Captain Vikram Batra

Captain Vikram Batra, 13 Jammu and Kashmir Rifles, and his Delta Company were given the task of recapturing Point 5140. He single-handedly killed three enemy soldiers in close combat which left him seriously injured. Unmindful of his injuries, he insisted on continuing with the task at hand. The brave soldier was tragically killed when he tried to rescue an injured officer during an enemy counter attack.



Subedar Joginder Singh Sahnian

Outnumbered by twenty to one in perilous weather conditions, Subedar Joginder Singh's platoon of 30 soldiers repelled two waves of enemies (200 in each) and despite being reduced to half, once again set themselves up. Lacking everything but spirit, Subedar Singh and his handful of men fixed bayonets on their rifles and wreaked havoc on Chinese with their war cry everywhere in air: 'Jo Bole So Nihal, Sat Sri Akal'. With obvious superiority in strength, the enemy finally managed to capture the nearly-dead hero of the Indian Army who took his last breath as a Chinese POW.

DRDO Successfully Tests High-Speed Indigenous Fighter Jet Escape System

December 3, 2025

The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has achieved a major breakthrough by carrying out a high-speed rocket-sled test of a fighter aircraft escape system in Chandigarh. This important trial proved that the pilot-saving technology works safely and effectively during emergencies. The test took place at the Rail Track Rocket Sled (RTRS) facility of the Terminal Ballistics Research Laboratory (TBRL). This advanced track allows scientists to check how escape systems perform at very high speeds, similar to real flying conditions.



Indian Scientists Develop AI Tool 'OncoMark' to Decode Cancer

November 28, 2025

In a major breakthrough in cancer research, Indian scientists have revealed 'OncoMark', an AI-powered diagnostic model that analyses cancer at the molecular level, potentially revolutionising how the disease is classified and treated. Developed by the S N Bose National Centre for Basic Sciences in collaboration with Ashoka University, this tool goes far beyond traditional cancer staging by identifying biological hallmarks that drive tumour growth, aggressiveness, and resistance to therapy.



Tata Memorial Breakthrough for Bladder Cancer

November 17, 2025

In a significant breakthrough in cancer care, Indian researchers from Tata Memorial Centre (TMC) have demonstrated that radiation therapy after bladder cancer surgery can drastically reduce the chances of cancer returning in the pelvic region. This marks the first high-level global evidence from an India-led trial and could revolutionize how high-risk bladder cancer patients are treated post-surgery.



Andhra Teen Selected for 2029 Space Mission Training — India's Rising Space Star

November 13, 2025

A 17-year-old girl from Andhra Pradesh, Kunchala Kaivalya Reddy, has achieved a remarkable milestone by being selected for a prestigious astronaut training programme in the United States. Her journey, starting from the town of Nidadavole in East Godavari district, now leads her to a four-year elite training that could put her into orbit by 2029. This development showcases India's growing participation in international space collaborations and puts a spotlight on the aspirations and talents emerging from small-town India.



Godrej Delivers Human-Rated Vikas Engine for Gaganyaan

November 13, 2025

India's human spaceflight programme gained momentum as Godrej Aerospace delivered the first human-rated L110 stage Vikas engine to the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO). The engine will power the LVM-3 launch vehicle that will carry Indian astronauts under the Gaganyaan mission, marking a major milestone in the country's space capabilities.

India has announced plans to construct the world's deepest underwater research laboratory at a depth of 6,000 metres in the Indian Ocean. The initiative forms a key pillar of the country's Vision 2047 strategy and aims to revolutionise marine science through long-duration missions and advanced deep-sea experimentation.



India Reveals First Quantum Diamond Microscope

November 13, 2025

At the forefront of scientific innovation, India has achieved a significant milestone with the launch of its first indigenous Quantum Diamond Microscope (QDM), developed by the P-Quest Group at IIT Bombay. Announced at ESTIC 2025 (Emerging Science Technology and Innovation Conclave), this cutting-edge tool is set to transform areas like neuroscience, materials science, and semiconductor diagnostics.



India's First Commercial PSLV Set to Launch Oceansat

November 20, 2025

India is gearing up for a historic moment in its space journey. For the first time, a Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV) has been built entirely by the private sector, and it is set to launch the Oceansat satellite early next year. The rocket, constructed by a consortium of Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) and Larsen & Toubro (L&T), marks a turning point in how India's proven space technologies are being commercialised.



Google Launches Gemini 3: The Most Intelligent AI Model Yet

November 19, 2025

On November 18, 2025, Google officially launched Gemini 3, its most intelligent and powerful AI model to date. Developed by Google DeepMind, Gemini 3 represents a major leap in artificial intelligence, combining multimodal understanding, agentic behavior, and state-of-the-art reasoning into a single unified system. The model builds on the legacy of Gemini 1 and 2 and is now available across Google's ecosystem — including Search, the Gemini app, AI Studio, Vertex AI, and Google Antigravity.

International Events

India Expands Visa on Arrival for UAE Nationals to Cochin, Calicut, Ahmedabad

November 21, 2025

In a move aimed at deepening bilateral ties and simplifying travel procedures, India has expanded its Visa-On-Arrival (VoA) facility for UAE nationals. Effective November 2025, UAE citizens can now access VoA services at Cochin, Calicut, and Ahmedabad international airports, in addition to the existing six international airports in Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai, Bengaluru, and Hyderabad. This brings the total number of entry points offering this facility to nine major airports across India.



India Re-Elected to UNESCO Executive Board for 2025–29 Term

India has once again secured a seat on the UNESCO Executive Board for the 2025–2029 term, marking a reaffirmation of its growing global leadership in promoting education, culture, science, and communication through multilateral cooperation. The announcement was made by the Permanent Delegation of India to UNESCO, highlighting that India's re-election reflects the global community's confidence in its sustained and meaningful contribution to UNESCO's mandate and its commitment to inclusive and human-centric development.

She is set to assume office in January 2026 for a four-year term, breaking a 50-year precedent since the organisation's founding in 1975.



Indian-Origin Hashmi Elected Virginia's Lt. Governor

November 06, 2025

In a landmark moment for both the Indian diaspora and U.S. politics, Ghazala Hashmi, an Indian-origin Democrat, has been elected Lieutenant Governor of Virginia, becoming the first Muslim and first South Asian American to hold the position in the state. The 61-year-old former educator secured 1,465,634 votes (54.2%), decisively defeating Republican rival John Reid, who garnered 1,232,242 votes.



Zohran Mamdani Elected Mayor of New York City

November 05, 2025

In a landmark moment for American urban politics, Zohran Mamdani has been elected Mayor of New York City, becoming the city's first Muslim mayor, the first person of South Asian descent to hold the office, and the youngest individual in over a century to win the post. His victory on 4 November 2025 reflects a major shift in the political landscape of one of the nation's largest and most diverse cities.

Rare Rustic Bunting Spotted for the First Time in Delhi NCR

December 1, 2025

A rare sighting of the rustic bunting at Najafgarh Jheel has marked a milestone for birdwatching in the National Capital Region. The passerine, scarcely recorded in India, was photographed and confirmed by local birders during a routine morning survey. Its appearance in India is uncommon, with only a few records from the Himalayas, Ladakh, Arunachal Pradesh and Kashmir over recent years.



India to Establish First National Coral Reef Research Centre in Andaman

November 29, 2025

India will soon inaugurate the National Coral Reef Research Institute (NCRRI) in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands, marking a major step in advancing marine conservation and



climate resilience. The centre aims to strengthen scientific understanding of coral ecosystems and enhance national capacity to protect vulnerable coastal zones.

37,000-year-old Manipur bamboo sheds new light on Asia's Ice Age climate.

November 29, 2025

A rare bamboo fossil discovered in Manipur's Imphal Valley has offered remarkable insight into plant evolution and climate resilience during the Late Pleistocene. The 37,000-year-old specimen, excavated from the silt-rich deposits of the Chirang River, preserves thorn scars and structural details almost never found in bamboo fossils, rewriting aspects of Asia's botanical history.



Galápagos Tortoise Gramma Dies at 141

Gramma, the oldest animal at the San Diego Zoo and a beloved Galápagos tortoise, has died

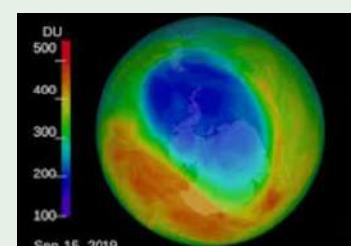

Antarctic Ozone Hole Shrinks to One of the Smallest in Decades

The 2025 Antarctic ozone hole has shown marked improvement, ranking as the fifth smallest since 1992 and breaking up weeks earlier than average. Scientists from NASA and NOAA link this positive trend to the long-term success of the Montreal Protocol, which has steadily reduced ozone-depleting chemicals in the atmosphere.

Rohit Sharma Writes History with Most Sixes in ODI Cricket

December 1, 2025

In a historic moment for world cricket, India's veteran opener Rohit Sharma became the highest six-hitter in One-Day International (ODI) history, surpassing Pakistan's Shahid Afridi. The record was achieved on November 30, 2025, during the first ODI against South Africa in Ranchi, adding another glittering milestone to Rohit's illustrious career. With this, the 38-year-old has cemented his legacy as one of the most destructive and consistent batsmen in limited-overs cricket.



Virat Kohli Surpasses Sachin Tendulkar with Record-Breaking 52nd ODI Century

December 1, 2025

In yet another monumental achievement, Virat Kohli etched his name deeper into cricket history by smashing his 52nd ODI century, surpassing Sachin Tendulkar's long-standing record for the most hundreds in One-Day Internationals. The historic knock came during the first ODI against South Africa in Ranchi on November 30, 2025, reaffirming Kohli's stature as one of the greatest batters of all time.



Javokhir Sindarov Crowned 2025 FIDE World Cup Champion

This month-long event, featuring 206 players, delivered unforgettable drama, technical brilliance, and historical milestones. Sindarov's victory not only earned him the prestigious title but also carved his name in history as the youngest FIDE World Cup Champion.



Ten Year Old British Chess Prodigy Stuns at Women's Event

A remarkable performance by ten year old Bodhana Sivanandan from Harrow in north west London saw her sweep through the UK Women's Blitz Championship in Royal Leamington Spa, winning eight games in a row against far more experienced adult female players. Her dominance earned her a spot among the top 50 women in the world for blitz chess, marking a significant milestone for youth in chess.

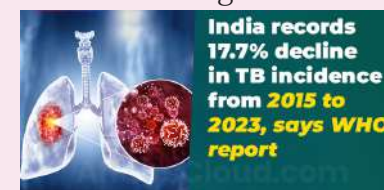
Lakshya Sen Clinches Australian Open Super 500 Title

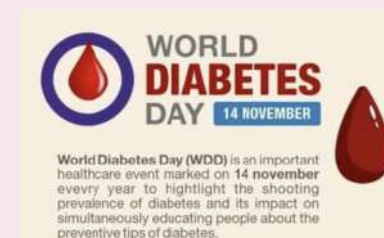

The report shows that India's TB incidence dropped by 21%—from 237 per lakh population in 2015 to 187 per lakh in 2024, almost double the global rate of decline (12%). 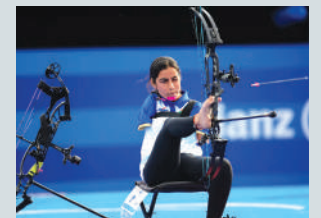

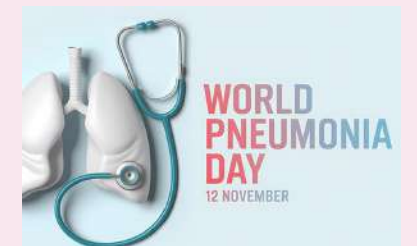

Scrub typhus surge in Andhra Pradesh: symptoms, risks and prevention

December 2, 2025

Andhra Pradesh is witnessing a sharp rise in scrub typhus infections, with districts such as Chittoor, Kakinada and Visakhapatnam reporting hundreds of cases. Health authorities warn that misdiagnosis as viral fever or seasonal illness is contributing to delayed treatment and increasing complications. It spreads through the bite of infected chiggers, the larval stage of mites commonly found in dense vegetation, paddy fields, bushes and waste-filled surroundings. Farmers, field workers, children playing outdoors and those living near overgrown areas are at higher risk.
