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
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FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



TALK SHOW

Topic : SIR and Influence on Voter Base ahead of Bihar Elections

The **Politico Club** of DPS Dwarka hosted an intellectually stimulating talk show for the students of Class X on 14th August 2025. The focal point of the discussion was the pertinent topic: '**SIR (Special Intensive Revision) as a Political Instrument to Influence the Voter Base Ahead of the Bihar Elections**'. The session was held under the guidance of Ms. Dalia Haldar, Teacher-in-charge of the club and was meticulously coordinated by the Club Presidents, Rashi Tripathi and Aditi Solanki, whose efforts ensured the smooth execution of the event.

The talk show witnessed thoughtful contributions from participants Mohisha and Lakshita, who articulated their perspectives with clarity and depth. The speakers examined how SIR, originally designed as an economic reform, is increasingly being leveraged as a political strategy to sway electoral outcomes.

They deliberated on the ethical dimensions of such practices, questioning whether these measures serve genuine developmental purposes or merely act as short-term populist tactics to secure votes.

The event concluded with words of appreciation for the participants and a reaffirmation of the importance of fostering political literacy and critical thinking among young learners. The **Politico Club** remains committed to organizing such enriching sessions that inspire informed dialogue and responsible citizenship.



DEBATE SESSION

TOPICS: FEDERALISM AND REGIONAL PARTIES;
DEMOCRACY AND TECHNOLOGY

The **Politico Club** of DPS Dwarka successfully organized an engaging debate session for the students of Classes XI and XII on 22nd August 2025. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation and intellectual exchanges on two thought-provoking topics: '**Does the Rise of Regional Parties strengthen Federalism?**' and '**Is the Growing use of Technology in Elections Strengthening Democracy?**'

For the first topic, '**Does the Rise of Regional Parties strengthen Federalism?**' the speakers for the motion were Vritika Singh and Moyna Malotra From Class XII-F, and Amartya Nath from Class XI-G. Speaking against the motion were Hemang Bishnoi and Samanvay Bajaj from Class XI-G, and Gresha Singh from Class XII-F. They contended that the rise of regional parties leads to political instability, encourages narrow agendas over national interest, and can create governance gridlocks, ultimately weakening national integration.



For the second topic, '**Is the Growing use of Technology in Elections Strengthening Democracy?**' Vritika from Class XII-F spoke for the motion, highlighting how electronic voting machines, online registration and tech-enabled systems enhance transparency. Speaking against the motion, Mannat Sachdeva from Class XI-G raised concerns regarding cybersecurity threats, potential hacking and the digital divide, all of which can undermine trust and accessibility in democratic processes.

RASHTRANEETI PROGRAMME

STUDENT ELECTION

The Rashtraneeti Programme was successfully conducted in the month of September by the organizing committee. The primary goal was to democratically elect student leaders for all Rashtraneeti committees for the 2025–26 session, promoting active citizenship and ethical governance. Its design reflected the core objectives of the Rashtraneeti initiative: fostering leadership skills and a clear understanding of civic responsibility among students. The entire electoral exercise was executed in three distinct and rigorous phases, ensuring maximum transparency and fairness throughout the process.

The first phase was **Application and Nomination**. Interested candidates submitted a detailed Statement of Purpose (SOP) outlining their vision for their chosen committee, such as Environment or Discipline along with relevant past experience.

The second phase involved intense scrutiny through the **Panel Interview and Group Debate**. Shortlisted students faced a formal interview focussed on problem-solving, decision-making under pressure and understanding civic duties. Immediately after the interviews, candidates participated in a **Group Debate** on contemporary issues related to school governance.

The final and most defining phase was the **Manifestation**. Final candidates for the top posts presented a 10-minute public manifesto to their peers and the selection panel, outlining their strategic plans for the upcoming year, mirroring a real-world election pitch.

Formation of Electoral Literacy Club

The Electoral Literacy Club was formed under the guidelines of the DOE of India as an initiative by Class 12 students of DPS Dwarka to spread awareness about the electoral process. Led by Presidents Aditi Solanki and Rashi Tripathi, the club educates students on the voters' list, the significance of informed voting, and the steps for voter registration once they reach eligible age. The club promotes responsible and aware future citizenship.



RASHTRANEETI PROGRAMME

FOSTERING ENVIRONMENTAL AWARENESS



The **Rashtraneeti Programme** aims to transform students into active citizens by providing them with hands-on experience in decision-making, elections and teamwork. As part of the programme's structure, each school is required to form various student-led committees, including those on Environment, Discipline and Welfare. At **DPS Dwarka**, the Environment Committee of the programme, became the central focus, led by elected members from the student body. These members were responsible for identifying environmental issues and implementing small-scale sustainability projects within the school. The event was primarily managed by Class XI students, who enthusiastically took charge of organizing, documenting and executing various sessions. The initiative was highly appreciated by the Vice Principal - Ms. Sushma Anthwal, who praised the students' dedication, creativity and commitment to meaningful change.

and guides the world to right the wrong.


So let us learn, debate, decide,

Beyond the Sketch




Rasipuram Krishnaswamy Laxman, popularly known as R.K. Laxman, was one of India's most celebrated political cartoonists, whose work reflected the pulse of Indian democracy for over five decades. Laxman had a deep interest in politics, society and human nature, which he expressed brilliantly through his art. Though not formally a student of political science, his understanding of political behaviour, power and governance was exceptional, making him one of the most insightful social commentators of independent India.




TIME'S OF YESTERDAY / R K LAXMAN March 24, 1958

POPULATION DYNAMICS

Understanding India's Age-Sex Ratio: political perspective

How population dynamics influence policy, governance and representation?

The age-sex ratio is one of the most vital demographic indicators reflecting how populations are distributed across gender and age groups. In 2025, India's population stands at approximately 1.44 billion, with a sex ratio of 1020 females per 1000 males, a gradual but significant improvement from the 2011 Census, which recorded 943 females per 1000 males.

India's age-sex ratio not only influences its economic development but also plays a critical role in shaping its political narratives. A youthful population brings energy, innovation and electoral dynamism, while an aging population necessitates policies on healthcare and pensions.

From parliamentary representation to local governance, these demographic factors guide how resources are allocated, which policies take priority and how political parties frame their campaigns. Understanding these ratios thus helps explain the intersection of demographics and democracy in India.



when real lives shake and voices stir.


They call it order, call it peace,

to make the world a fairer way.



WAR IS PEACE; IGNORANCE IS STRENGTH


Today, we find ourselves in a situation where it isn't hard to find firm believers (unknowingly) of George Orwell's political dystopia: where war is peace, freedom is slavery and ignorance is strength. Amid this, we need a reminder of what war truly is. This editorial explores the ahistorical warmongering that continues to plague humanity.

Unsurprisingly, people and political groups across ideologies have often come together to aggressively call for war. The lines between otherwise rigid in-groups and out-groups tend to blur when it comes to such collective madness. But make no mistake, this unity exists only in the context of war and never in peace. Many of our peers, those who have never witnessed war firsthand and those who do not care enough to learn about it, boldly express their support for it on social media and in daily discussions. This support often takes the form of hate, directed not only toward other nations but also against our own people. The mass media, especially social and television media, aren't of much help. In fact, they are often on a mission to amplify jingoism and xenophobia, market it as news and deliver it to the masses.



The histrionics on display are disrespectfully intentional and intentionally disrespectful. Guns, bombs and military helicopters flash across screens as anchors screech hatred and get their pockets filled. And we, as consumers of journalism, are made to believe that to be silent is to be unpatriotic. What we do not realise is that our call for war might not affect us immediately, but it soon will. When our work and education are disrupted, when resources are endangered, when loved ones are lost, the illusion of strength will collapse. It is easy to glorify war until we remember that behind every flag waved with fervour lies the flag that soldiers come back wrapped in. Thousands throughout history have returned this way. It might be easy for us to look at these numbers, but humans aren't numbers. We are more than the flesh and blood we physically occupy. What sets us apart — what makes us beautiful — is our love. Let that beauty not be snatched. Ignorance is weak, planned guilt. War is inhumane, destructive, and ugly.




