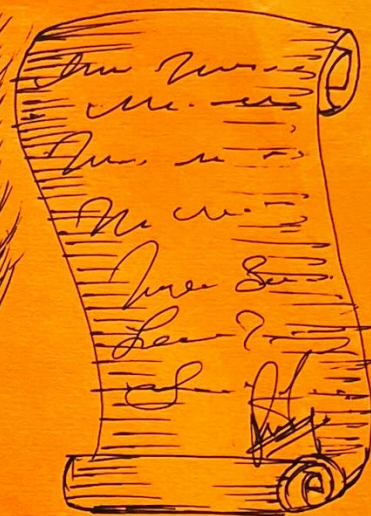
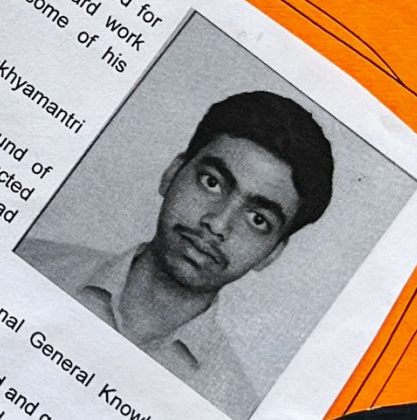
Chess: Competed in international chess tournaments with a FIDE rating of 1504.

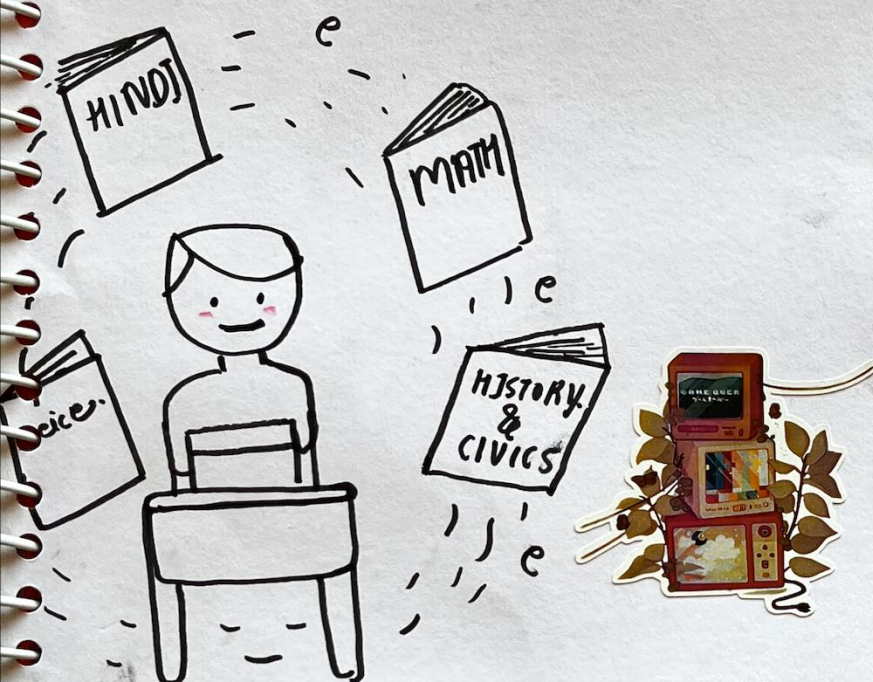

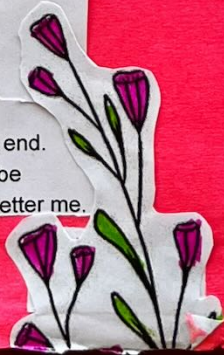

One thing I especially liked was the positive environment in the school. It has encouraged me to stay motivated and try my best every day. There is a spirit of competitiveness among the students.

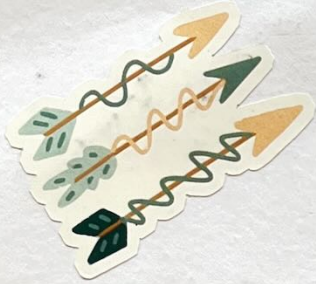

A comprehensive Board Examination Academic Support Session was organised for the students of Class X to help them prepare effectively for all subjects in the upcoming examinations. The session aimed at boosting students' confidence, enhancing their exam strategies and improving overall performance.

The session was informative and practical, helping students gain clarity and confidence to appear in the Board Examination.



Subject : English

The session focussed on effective use of reading time and section-wise strategies to score maximum marks in Reading, Writing, Grammar and Literature. Students were guided on how to approach each section confidently and manage time efficiently.

Common mistakes to be avoided were discussed, along with important presentation skills such as neat handwriting, proper structuring of answers and highlighting key points. To give students a clear understanding, model answers from previous years' question papers and the CBSE sample paper answer key were also shown and explained.

Subject : Mathematics

The session began with the discussion on Course structure of the subject and the blue print of the CBSE question paper with an overview of the most common mistakes students make in Mathematics, such as misreading questions, calculation errors, skipping steps, incorrect use of formulae and poor time management. The teachers explained through examples as to how even small errors can lead to loss of valuable marks.

Special emphasis was laid on the importance of step-wise presentation, proper use of mathematical symbols and neat diagrams. The students were guided on how to manage time effectively, attempt questions strategically and revise answers before submission. Tips for remembering formulae, checking calculations and avoiding careless mistakes were also shared.

The Powerpoint presentation included sample Board questions, highlighting common errors and demonstrating the correct approach in solving them. The session concluded with motivational guidance encouraging regular practice, concept clarity and self-confidence.



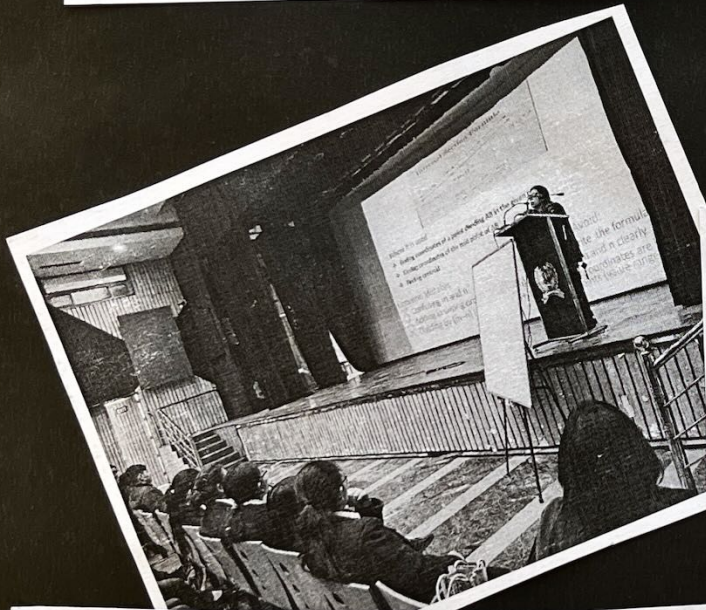

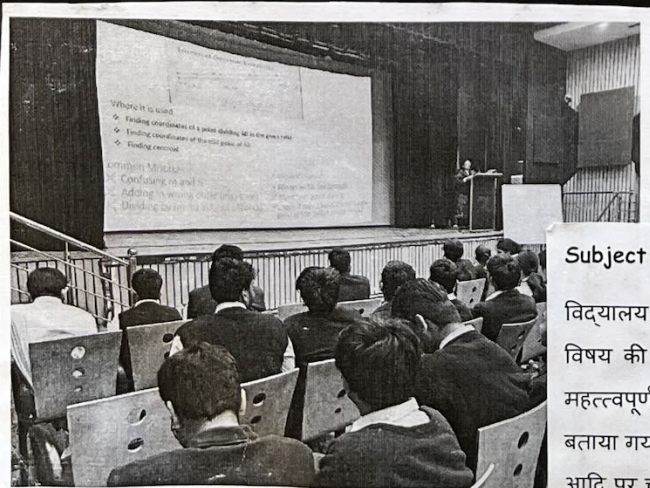
Subject : Science
