

REPORT ON ROAD SAFETY WORKSHOP

In today's fast-paced world, increasing traffic and growing negligence have made road safety a matter of urgent concern. To instil awareness and responsibility among students at an early age, Sadhu Vaswani International School for Girls organized a Road Safety Workshop on 29th January'2026, conducted by officials from the Traffic Police Department.

Students were guided on safe road-crossing practices, including the correct use of zebra crossings, traffic signals, and pedestrian rules. The concept of being alert pedestrians and responsible cyclists was also discussed.

The session was highly interactive, with students actively participating by asking questions related to traffic signs, helmet safety, penalties, and emergency situations. The officials patiently addressed all queries, making the session informative and engaging.
