Field Trip to Jamali Kamali, Mehrauli Archaeological Park, New Delhi on 22nd January, 2026

As part of the Jal Itihas project, a field trip was organised to the Jamali Kamali complex at Mehrauli Archaeological Park, New Delhi on 22nd January, 2026. A total of 25 students accompanied by two teachers participated in this enriching educational visit. The session was conducted by Ms. Smita and her team, along with students from six different schools, making it an interactive and collaborative learning experience.

During the visit, students explored several important historical and archaeological sites within the park. Key observations included the Jamali Kamali Mosque, known for its impressive Indo-Islamic architecture, and the Jamali Kamali Tomb, which reflects the artistic and cultural heritage of the Mughal period. Students also visited Rajaon Ki Baoli, a historic stepwell, which helped them understand the traditional water conservation systems used in earlier times.
