



Navigating Adolescence



But trust me don't fall into that flame.


But you must learn to accept them and work hard,

So I stood up again and didn't break down.




When I was 3 years old,

Grabbed the key, and finally, crack! JACKPOT!


And now, the memory rises


It almost seems like an experiment lab," said Samuel.

Among many lessons we learn.


From basketball to swimming we do,

Even the lifeless can cross.*


*The machines hum on opposite walls,

Skills Beyond the Classroom

Science is not just a subject—it is a life skill.



A true scientist observes carefully, asks questions, tests ideas, and learns from mistakes. In everyday life, this means not accepting everything at face value, but thinking logically before making decisions.

Whether you are choosing healthy food, solving a problem with friends, or understanding news on social media, use the scientific habit of questioning “Why?” and “How?”. Mistakes are not failures—they are experiments that teach us what to improve next.

Scientific Life Skills from Our Kitchen

1. Adding Salt to Boiling Water – Science of Timing

In our daily cooking, we often add salt while boiling water for rice or vegetables. Scientifically, salt slightly increases the boiling point of water and also dissolves better in hot water. Adding salt at the right time helps food absorb flavour evenly without over-salting.

This teaches us the importance of timing and decision-making. Just like in cooking, doing the right thing at the right moment in life gives better results.

2. Using Oil and Butter Together – Smart Combination

Butter adds flavour but burns quickly due to its low smoke point. Oil, on the other hand, has a higher smoke point. When both are used together, oil prevents butter from burning while butter improves taste.

This shows us the value of smart combinations and teamwork. When different strengths come together, we get better outcomes—both in the kitchen and in life.

3. Lemon Is Added at the End – Science of Sequencing

Lemon juice is acidic. When added early during cooking, it can slow down cooking and destroy vitamin C due to heat. Adding lemon at the end preserves nutrients and fresh flavour.

This teaches sequencing and planning. Doing tasks in the correct order is essential for success, whether in cooking, studies, or daily life.





4. Salt Reduces Bitter Taste – Problem Solving with Science

A small pinch of salt can reduce bitterness in vegetables. Scientifically, salt affects our taste receptors and balances flavours.

This encourages problem-solving and careful judgement. Instead of giving up when something goes wrong, a thoughtful solution can improve the situation.

Our kitchen is not just a place for cooking—it is a science laboratory where important life skills are learned every day. Understanding the science behind simple actions helps students become more aware, confident, and responsible in their daily lives.


Puzzle: Handshake Counting

Diagram idea: Dots for students, lines for handshakes.



Why This Matters

One simple question unlocks a big idea: how many connections are possible, and how to count them smartly without repetition.

The same thinking forms the basis of combinatorics and is used in social media networks, computer systems, and sports tournaments.

Try It Yourself: Passing the Ball

Q) In a playground, 12 students stand in a circle. Each student passes the ball once to every other student. No pass is repeated. How many total ball passes will happen?

Answer: 66 ball passes.
