Dear Parent

As your child progresses to Class III, we are delighted to share an important transition that marks a significant step in their academic journey. We aim to build a robust foundation for the Preparatory Stage in alignment with the latest NEP and NCF guidelines. At Preparatory Stage (Classes III-V), the focus gradually shifts from play-based pedagogy to Activity-Oriented Learning. Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN) remain the most important focus in these years, especially in Class III. Mother Teacher concept replaces subject-wise teaching to enhance subject-specific understanding and to gradually foster independent learning and responsibility among students resulting in:

- Deeper understanding of each subject through specialized teaching
 - Exposure to diverse teaching methods and learning styles
 - Development of self-discipline and organisational skills
- The school is conscious of the fact that a light bag is a must for the physical well-being of a child. Keeping this in mind:
- Students must carry books and notebooks strictly according to the timetable.
 - Mathematics Kit, General Knowledge, Computer, Vocabulary, Spellathon, Resource books and Grammar books will be kept in school. The same will be sent back home from time to time.
 - Regarding language books, a message will be shared on the portal by the respective teacher and the same to be brought to school accordingly.
 - All notebooks should be properly covered, labeled, and maintained neatly.
- Classwork and all circulars will be uploaded on the parent portal. Classwork and homework must be completed regularly and sincerely.
- Notebooks will be checked regularly after the completion of a particular topic and not necessarily on daily basis. Therefore, it is essential that students keep their work up to date at all times, irrespective of checking schedules.
 - Parents are requested to monitor their ward's work periodically to ensure consistency.
- All Scholastic, Co-Scholastic and Self-awareness record will be maintained in the 'Student Portfolio' showcasing the holistic development of students throughout the year.
- Regularity and punctuality are essential to foster self-discipline among students. Marks for attendance will be awarded at the end of each term for the same.
- The well-being of our school community is a shared priority. To ensure a safe and healthy learning environment for all, we request parents not to send their child to school if he/she is unwell. Staying home ensures a faster recovery for your child and helps prevent the spread of illness within the classroom.
- Absence During Assessments: If an examination is missed due to health reasons, please submit a medical certificate along with a formal application within 3 days of your initial notification to the school.

We seek your cooperation in helping your child adapt smoothly to this new system. Together, let us encourage them to become confident and responsible learners.
