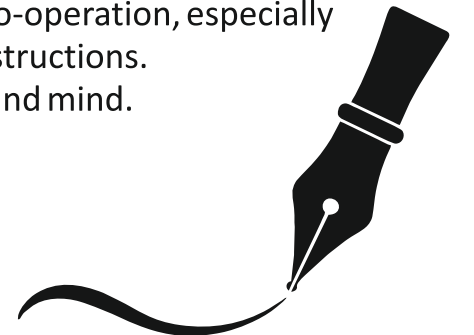

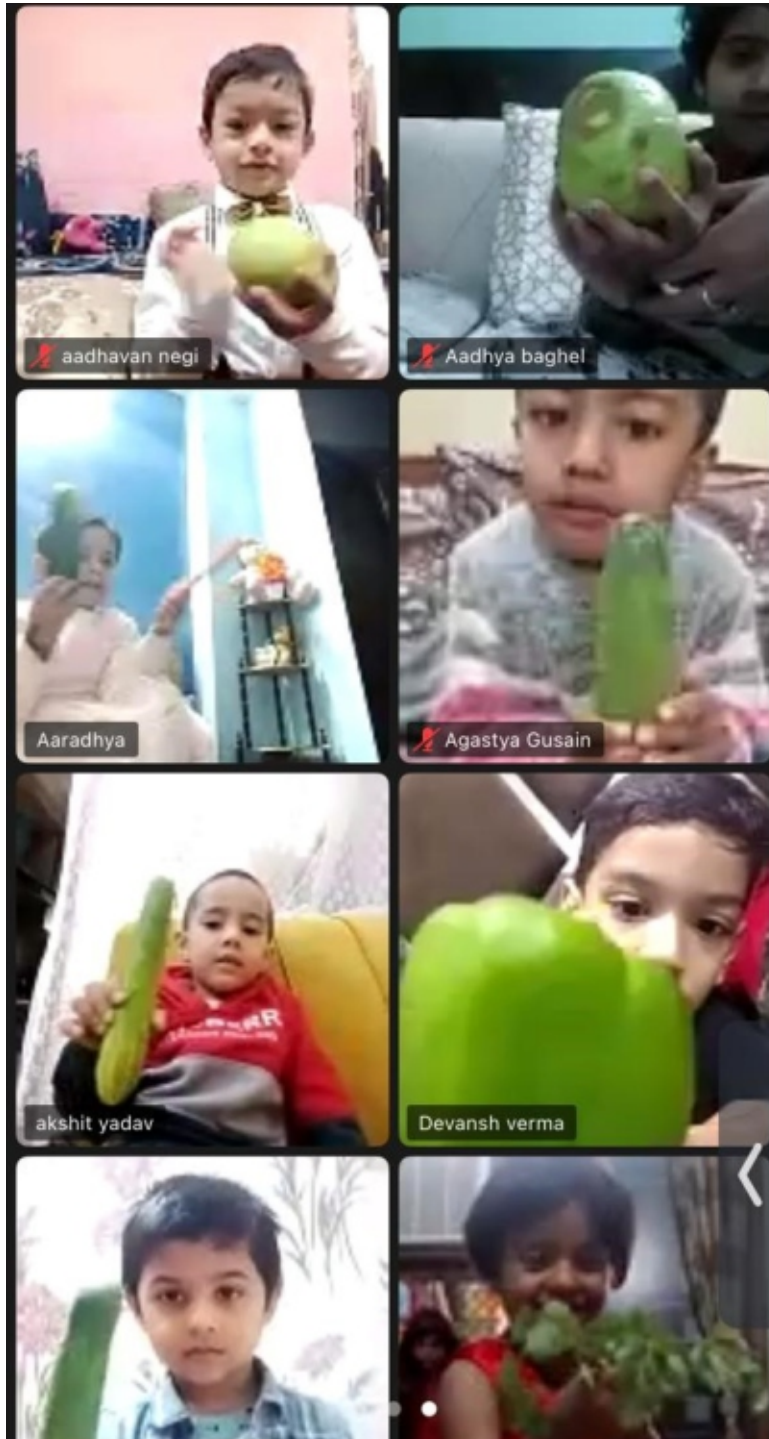


CHILDREN'S DAY CELEBRATION

27-11-2025

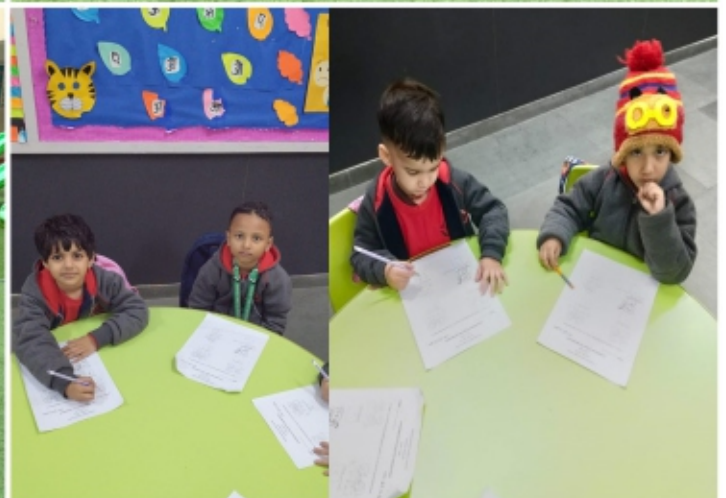
“A hundred mistakes are an education if you learn something from each one.”

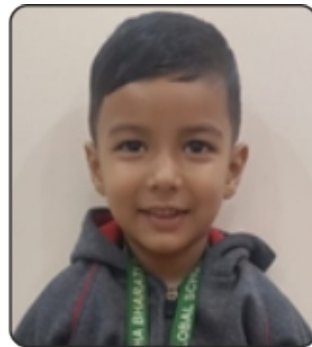

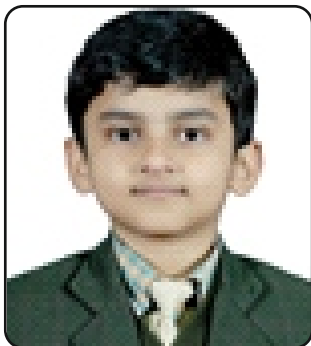

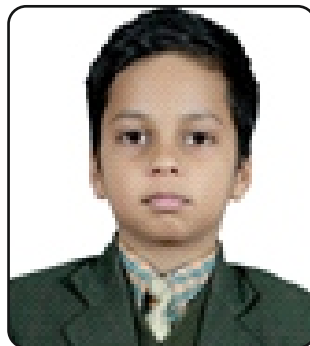

Activities included digital decluttering Techniques :

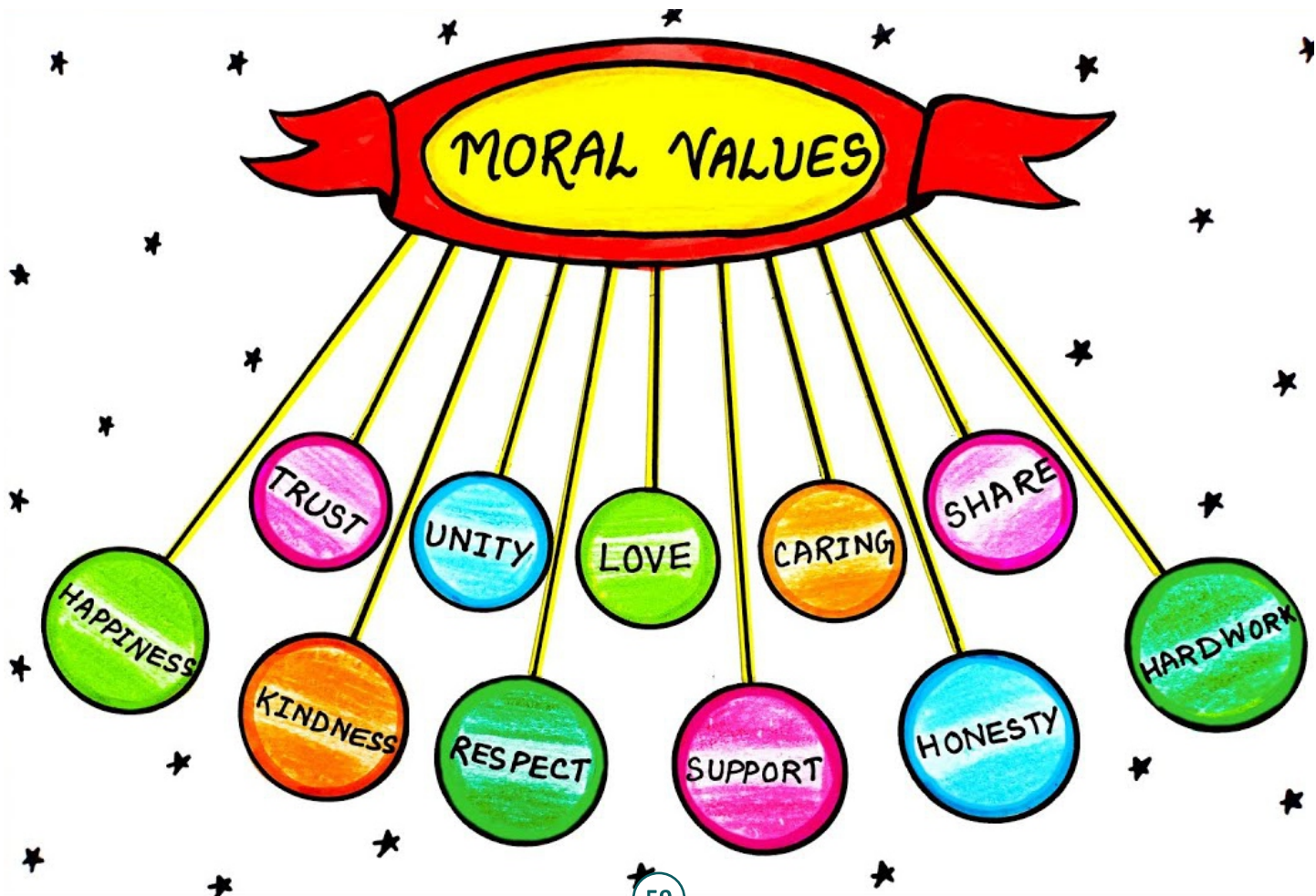
- **Email Management** : To teach techniques for unsubscribing from unwanted emails, organizing emails into folders and implementing email filtering rules.
