### Research project

Students of Class XI are requested to submit a Research based Project on any one **Contemporary Social Issue**.

You may choose any of the following topics:

- Urban migration and social solidarity.
- Social media and community life.
- Religion and community cohesion.
- Crime and social order.
- Environmental issues and social responsibility.
- How unemployment affects youth confidence.
- How migration changes family life.
- How social media affects peer relationships.
- Consumerism and social status

### Instructions for the project-

(a) Conduct interviews, Surveys and then pen down your observation.

(b) With the help of your presentation prepare a beautifully decorated project file. (This should be hand written. Typed or printed sheets will not be considered)

(c) Project file should be made in the given sequence-

- Cover page with Title
- Research Question- Decompose the topic into at least 5 concrete research questions or indicators
- Introduction of the topic- 10- 15 pages
- Rationale of study

- Why did you choose the topic?

- Objectives of your study

### • DATA COLLECTION-

**SECONDARY DATA-** Review of Literature: it should be in the following sequence:

- Title of the Article/Book
- Year of Publication
- Name of the Author
- Introduction (a small summary of the article/book)
- Objectives of the article/book- Main argument of the Author
- Results and finding- Conclusion of the Article
- Analysis- Your understanding of the Article

**PRIMARY DATA-** How will you conduct your research:

- Interview, Sample survey
- Case study

• **METHODOLOGY-** Questionnaire- The questionnaire should have 15 questions. It can include

- Open-ended questions
- Close-ended Questions

• Observation and Data Analysis - Interpret any ALL Questions either through a Pie-Chart or Bar Diagram

• Conclusion- It should include the inferences you draw from your research.

• Bibliography - Mention all the sources you have collected the data of your research.
