She will hide numbers in the classroom. Give clues: “I come just after 10.” “I am one more than 7.” Children will find the cards and shout the number.	UNDERWATER LIFE The teacher will show children pictures of aquatic animals and briefly discuss underwater life— Fish, turtles, octopuses and sea plants live under water. Children will create a collaborative underwater life collage by pasting pre-cut fish, aquatic animals, seaweed, shells and bubbles on a blue chart/paper. They can also add cotton for bubbles and blue paper strips for water.	LET’S HELP OUR SEA FRIENDS The teacher will explain that aquatic animals need clean water and a safe home to live happily. Children will be shown an “ocean” setup containing toy aquatic animals along with objects such as polybags, plastic bottles, cans and other waste materials. Children will identify the waste items and remove them from the ocean, placing them in a dustbin. The teacher will explain that we should never throw plastic or waste into

WORD OF THE DAY: SPLASH L-1 (ENGLISH) INTRODUCTION OF LETTER 'W' The teacher will introduce letter W by showing familiar objects/pictures such as Watermelon, Watch, Whale and Wheel.		FEED MR. HUNGRY SHARK The teacher will show a shark with an open mouth, a numeral card and some fishes too. Children will identify the numeral and count the corresponding number of paper fish before feeding them to the shark. 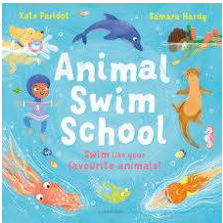
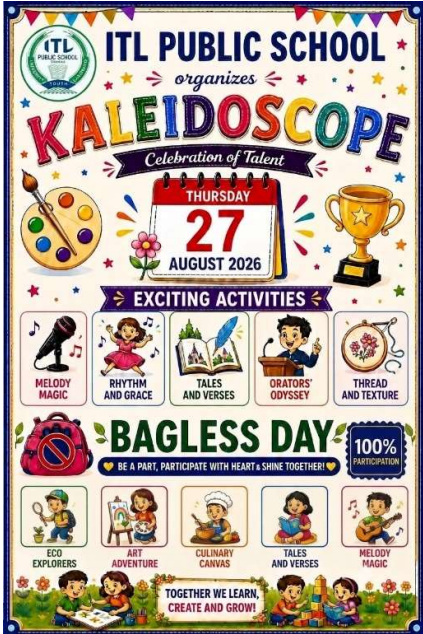

RAKHI FOR NATURE – A BOND OF CARE The teacher will explain that just as Rakhi celebrates the bond of love and protection between siblings, we can also care for and protect nature. The students will make eco-friendly rakhi and will be taken to the school garden, where they will gently tie the handmade rakhi around a tree or plant. They will be encouraged to say, “I will protect and care for nature.” (RAKSHA BANDHAN) Story of Rani Karnavati and Humayun – Raksha Bandhan Long ago, Rani Karnavati of Mewar was facing danger from an enemy army. Worried about protecting her kingdom and her people, she sent a Rakhi to Emperor Humayun, asking for his help. Humayun was deeply touched by the gesture. He accepted the Rakhi and considered Rani Karnavati his sister. He
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							decided to help and protect her, showing that the bond of Raksha Bandhan goes beyond blood relations. This story is often told as a beautiful example of love, trust, respect, and the promise to protect one another—the values celebrated through Raksha Bandhan. Message for children: <i>Raksha Bandhan teaches us that a true bond of love and care is built on respect, trust, and looking after each other.</i>
