Here are some tips to help make this break both joyful and meaningful:

* Welcome guests with a warm smile.

* Have at least two meals (preferably breakfast and dinner) together as a family. Teach your child to appreciate and not waste food.

* Use this time to instill good table manners during meals.

* Share your childhood stories and family traditions with your child.

* Make storytelling a daily habit.

* Teach your child to care for their belongings.

* Create a balanced routine that includes time for play, revision, and watching TV (preferably educational programs like Discovery Kids and Animal Planet).

- * Communicate with your child in English regularly.
- * Involve them in organizing their toy shelf.
- * Encourage them to water the plants regularly.
- * Teach the use of polite words like "please," "sorry," and "thank you."
- * Engage in simple, meaningful conversations.
- * Emphasize personal hygiene:
- * Brush teeth twice daily.
- * Bathe regularly.
- * Comb hair neatly.
- * Wash hands before meals.
- * Trim nails and keep them clean.

Holiday Homework Guidelines:

Help your child revise the conversation questions from the April-May monthly planners .

Parent-child task: - 1-Create and decorate a pencil holder.

2- Creative task: Make a collage with pictures of places like markets, schools, hospitals, and residential areas.

Language Development Activities:

Story Time: Narrate simple fairy tales (e.g., Cinderella, Red Riding Hood, The Pied Piper, Rapunzel, Sleeping Beauty). Ask simple questions to help your child recall characters and events.

* Encourage the use of polite expressions like "thank you," "please," and "excuse me."

Show and Tell: Let your child pick an object daily and speak a few lines about it.

Rhyme Time: Recite rhymes with voice modulation and actions like: "One Little Finger, Tap Tap Tap" and "If You're Happy and You Know It."

Special Days to Celebrate:

June 5: Celebrate – "International Environment Day". Talk to your child about the importance of protecting our planet.

June 17: Mother-child activity—make a Father's Day card together and present it to Dad. Take a few pictures and paste them in your drawing file.

June 21: Celebrate "International Yoga Day" with your family and friends.

Help your child learn to answer the following:

- 1. What is your name?
- 2. What is your father's name?
- 3. What is your mother's name?
- 4. What is your home address?
- 5. What is your father's/mother's contact number?
