



Instructions

Activity 1- “From Field to Plate – The Journey of Our Food”

2. Write 1–2 sentences for each step.


3. Make a small table showing 2 Rabi and 2 Kharif crops and whether they need more rain.

 - Why that feature helps the plant survive

SOCIAL SCIENCE

Good Citizen Project: “My Good Deeds Passport”

Objective: Help students understand the qualities and responsibilities of a good citizen.

Activity:

- Design a “Good Citizen Passport” – a small handmade booklet with a cover page and 8–10 pages inside.
- Each page represents a “good deed” a child does during the holidays, such as:
 - Helping parents at home
 - Throwing garbage in the dustbin
 - Planting a tree or watering plants
 - Saying “thank you” and “sorry”
 - Following traffic rules while walking with adults
 - Sharing toys/books with friends or siblings



The student will:

- Draw or paste a picture (or click one) of the deed
- Write 2-3 lines describing it

- Ask parents/guardians to sign or stamp the page like a real passport
- Decorate the passport with symbols of India like the tricolour, Ashoka Chakra, etc.

OR

Sports and Games: “India’s Playground – A Scrapbook”



Objective: Explore traditional and modern games played in India.

Activity:

- Make a scrapbook divided into two sections:
- Traditional Games (e.g., Kho Kho, Gilli Danda, Kabaddi)
- Modern Sports (e.g., Cricket, Tennis, Football)
- For each game, include:
- Picture or sketch
- Short description: how it’s played, number of players
- Which state/region it’s popular in
- Fun Fact or famous player
- Optional: Paste a photo of yourself playing one of them!
